All of us have things we have learned over the years. To some of us things come naturally, to others those things require very hard work to master. 
I can't imagine how many United Methodist churches and church members have been affected by these fires, not to mention how many residents have lost homes, possessions, and loved ones.

Some Thoughts That Are Probably Alien To You...

A re there now, or have there ever been any living, breathing aliens from "outer space" hovering around or hanging out anywhere near planet earth?



One place we should all level up is tending to our *Faith*.







Methodist Men

Eighteen Trinity United Methodist men met for fellowship and breakfast on January 4th. The meeting was called to order by Don Frye at 8:15 a.m. and started with the introduction of two new members, Terry Tychan and Mitch Ortega. After introductions Don Stacks presented a devotion and prayer focused on starting the new year.

Treasurer Jim Williams updated the group on its finances, noting that the Pancake Breakfast brought in \$425. Discussion then turned to potential costs to be associated events through spring—Pancake Breakfast, Chili Cookoff, and Easter Sunrise Services. Jim also noted that a check was being sent for our Methodist Men membership. In general, our finances are in very good shape.



Don F. asked which members were able to help on the January 18th **Pancake Breakfast**. Several men volunteered to serve or cook and four to help setup Fellowship Hall on the 17th. A question regarding format—all you can eat versus take out—with consensus being that a separate ticket would be required of those who ate in Fellowship Hall, and then wanted a takeout breakfast. As in past breakfasts local first responders will be invited to participate at no cost to them. Discussion then turned to increased event advertising with no final decision being made.

It was noted that we have had a steady membership, but we need to bring in more men. Barry Bruner, TUMC Council Chair, said that 2025 was going to be a year of invitation. Several suggestions were discussed, including creating business cards to be handed out and participating in Jenson Beach's Jamin Jensen Thursday events. It was suggested that each member attempt to personally invite a new member to our next meeting.

The meeting was closed in prayer at 9:20 a.m.

God's Important Messages about Prayerfuliness:


Prayer involves speaking and listening. Prayer is more than a list of requests; it is conversation with God; use the Lord's Prayer as a spine or outline.

- Jesus' final prayer before the Last Supper shows a great example of him and God speaking (John 17)









Church Council

Trinity's Church Council met on Sunday afternoon, January 19th, to discuss matters of concern to the church, hear committee reports and recommendations, and act on motions brought before it. The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Singh at 3:00 p.m. and the November 2024 meeting minutes were accepted.

Trustees: Levi Miller reported that parking lot lighting was being updated and security cameras would be added to the lot. He also said that listening enhancements for the sanctuary were being investigated. Ear buds to enhance services were being investigated for the hard of



hearing and that large print Bibles were already available in the back of the sanctuary.

Finance: Dale Forbes and Jim Williams reported that Trinity's finances were in good shape and that 2024 was financially sound. Jim reported that stewardship was off to a good start and that stewardship reminders would be introduced throughout the year.

Council Chair: Barry Brunner noted that 2025 was looking good with gross income up. He discussed increasing stewardship and outreach programs for 2025. Earlier investigation of associate church membership found that associate membership for seasonal members was allowed and will be the focus of communicating this to seasonal TUMC members. He also noted that the TUMC Directory would be updated.

Lay Delegate to Annual Conference: Sue Nance led a discussion on attracting "disenchanted" church members back into the mainstream, using the Line Dancers as an example. Discussion focused on other ways to engage the disenchanted and attract others to TUMC.

Pastor's Report: The Pastor reported attendance was coming back from COVID-19 but that the changes in how Gen-Xers perceive church has changed with fewer attending "mainstream" services. He noted that online attendance has doubled on our YouTube® channel. He asked the Council to extend discipleship as far as possible. Further analysis of attendance will be conducted throughout 2025.

Congregational Care: Rick Decker reported that the New Member Orientation being held at 10:15 a.m. worked well and that TUMC will welcome three new members this month. Rick also talked about outreach, adult Sunday School, and volunteerism. A volunteer appreciation event will be held again this year.

Priscilla Circle: Pat Williams informed the Council that Priscilla Circle had 16 women attending the last meeting, with one being new. Priscilla Council donated \$1,000 to help support UMCORR's Los Angles fire recovery, that 73 pounds of food had been donated to the House of Hope, and Noisy Change had raised \$342.50 Heffer International's poverty and hunger program.

Men's Ministry: Don Frye reported a successful Pancake Breakfast, raising over \$900 from meals and that an additional \$69 for World Hunger. Men's Ministry will be running the February 1st Chili Cookoff, Pancake Breakfasts in February and March, and picnics for July and August were being planned.

Communications: Randy Schwartz announced that TUMC's Bible Study was now on Facebook and suggested a Ricksaw be purchased for advertising purposes. She continues to focus on outreach with such things as participaing local events (i.e., Jammin Jensen, concerts).

Family Promise. A family has been in residence on the 2^{nd} floor for the last two weeks and will continue to stay for two or three weeks.





About three weeks after getting home, Ed was doing really good, going places, going to church, going out for breakfast, dinner and anywhere he wanted. Now it was time for him to show his appreciation. Ed being a big man was embarrassed to get on a small hospital scale, so he bought a scale that went right in the floor, so no one had the problem of trying to balance themself. Then he wrote a check out for \$1000.00, made out to John, but needed his last name. The hospital office said, "We have never had a man nurse working the late shift, only women, and we don't have anyone with the name of John that is a nurse". Ed's wife said she was there every night, and she had seen John the first time and the last time he came into the room, and she swears he is telling the truth.
