

This Christmas, as my family and I dine together, the chair where Kathy, my mother-in-law, used to sit will likely be unoccupied.




## From the Media Department

so moving as Trinity's Choir and Drama Team share the Christmas story.




As we come to the close of another calendar year, those of us in Media want to express our best wishes for you and your family in the New Year. We also thank you for those times when you were

# We Have Been Given So Much...What Are *You* Doing With What You Have Been Given?



## From the Music Program


## O Come, Let Us Adore Him! The Angels Sang! The Shepherds Worshiped! The Magi Adored!

To quote Chris Tomlin, a well-known Christian composer, "I absolutely love everything about Christmas music!" And, why do we love Christmas music so much? It's because it gives us an escape from crazy stress when our endorphins bring a pleasant brain effect. We remember good times, Christmas lights, church carols and all of those feelings of warm-fuzziness! It's why we sing praises to God through *Joy To The World* and *O Come*, *All Ye Faithful*, and it's why we incorporate a Christmas Carol Sing-Along at our Christmas Eve service.

It all started with the singing! The angels sang! The shepherds worshiped! The Wise Men adored! Adoration is a word that we love to use during the Christmas season, thanks largely to the classic carol *O Come*, *All Ye Faithful* as we sing, "O come, let us adore Him." So many of us during the Christmas season spend more time thinking about Christ and giving Him adoration than any other season. Think about it for a moment. More people go to church during Christmas than any other time of the year. We also tend to find ourselves singing and listening to songs about Jesus more during the Christmas season. As a result, Christmas is a time when we love to praise Him, honor Him, and adore Him much in the way *Philippians 2:9–11* describes. While it's great that Christ earns so much of our attention and adoration during Christmas, it's important to remember that we should pay that same amount of attention to Him twelve months a year instead of just one. Sure, it's easier to get caught up in all the Christmas hype and spend more time thinking, singing, praying, and adoring Christ during December, but in order to have a true relationship with Christ we must adore and spend time with Him daily and not just during Christmas. This year as we move out of the Christmas season and back into the normalcy of life, let's strive to find a way to capture that Christmas spirit that will enable us to adore Him and grow with Him every day of our lives.

**DEUTERONOMY** 

The Book of Deuteronomy contains a repeat of all the Mosaic laws, plus an account of the death of Moses. It is the only book to record Moses' death. The children who had left Egypt were adults when Deuteronomy was written. They were quite ready to battle for the Promised Land. Deuteronomy repeats the laws in other books, specifically directing it to this new generation.

1.	This man took over for Moses when he passed away. (Deuteronomy 31:1-7)	
2.	This is the mountain that Moses climbed before he died there. (Deuteronomy 34:1)














## DEUTERONOMY







#### **OVERVIEW**

The Book of Deuteronomy contains a repeat of all the Mosaic laws, plus the death of Moses. It is the only book in the first five books of the Bible—the Pentateuch—to record Moses' death. It contains what seem like redundant speeches on the subject of remaining with God and not forgetting about Him. However, as the history of the Jewish people progresses, we can see that not even the repetition of calls to morality could keep the people on the straight and narrow path.



People do not live by BREAD alone but by the WORD of God(8:3)

Every **SEVEN** years people were required to cancel their debts (15:1)

People were forbidden from engaging in SORCERY or WITCHCRAFT (18:10)

The children of Israel were given a land flowing with MILK and HONEY (26:9)

SECRET things belong to God, but REVEALED things belong to the people and their children (29:29)

MOSES saw the Lord face to face (34:10)

Moses offered a **BLESSING** or cursing and asked the people to choose life so that their children would live (30:19)

First make clean the inside of the cup and of the plate, so that the outside may become equally clean. Matthew 23:26



Deuteronomy contains speeches and instructions that may seem redundant to all spoken throughout the Pentateuch. However, it serves as a record to show how God and Moses strived to emphasize the need for loyalty and sticking to the law. The future of these people bears out how easy it was for them to stray and to reveal that neither God nor Moses was over-speaking. Numbers ended with Israel in Moab, where the Jordan River flows into the Dead Sea. The entire Book of Deuteronomy takes place there. Moses gives his farewell address and encourages the army to stay God-centered after crossing the Jordan. The book is most known in Christian circles for its exclusive coverage of the death of Moses.
