




Family Fun Fall Festival!


November 4, 2023, from 2 p.m.–5 p.m.

From the Music Program

Why Worship?

Let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker.—Psalm 91:6

Why do we worship God? Must we? Is it a command? For one thing, if we don't worship God... "Then will the very rocks cry out!" (Luke 19:40). And Matthew 4:10 says, "You shall worship the Lord your God and Him only shall you serve!"

We worship Him to know Him more; to express our love for Him; to obey His Word; to thank Him for everything! Think about Who God is for a moment! He is the Almighty, One True Living God! Imagine that, and then think that we can talk to Him as often as we wish and He's always there—because He loves us! He LOVES US! When I focus on God in this way, it is so humbling! It brings me to a place of thankfulness. I'm compelled to tell Him what He means to me and how I'm so grateful for all He's done. How beautiful it is to sit in the presence of our God and know Him in that intimate way. It's the definition of peace, love, hope, joy, safety all rolled into one! It is overwhelming!

We often think of worship as "the song service segments of church services", but it's so much more! It's reading the Bible, praying, and talking to the Lord, telling others about Him, helping people in need, and Serving God. It's all worship!


Music is an important component of worship. Sometimes, singing to Him lifts us high above whatever is happening in our lives. God created music and I think He loves it when we sing to or play an instrument for Him. The Bible speaks a great deal about worship including the lifting of hands (Psalm 141:2), clapping hands (Psalm 47:1), bowing down (Psalm 95:6), and kneeling (Psalm 95:6). In all these ways we show surrender and awe and praise to our Lord.

We can sing our worship anywhere: in church, at home, in the car, on a walk, in the morning, afternoon, or evening. We can talk to Him and worship Him continually throughout our day. I vividly remember my father speaking words of worship in the middle of the night as he changed positions while fast asleep! When I was young, we all slept with our doors open, and I could clearly hear my dad whispering words of praise while sleeping! It was very comforting to me because I knew my father was there, and I learned early on that we can worship God anywhere and anytime because our spirits never sleep, and God is always awake. That's amazing!

In the end, worship is not about our feelings. It's about GOD and Him alone! God loves His worshippers much more than the worship itself; I believe. He wants our heart, not just a song! Why worship? Because He is God and Worthy of Praise! Let's bow down in worship and kneel before the Lord, our Maker. (Psalm 91-6)



Fruit Fly Problem?

Have you ever been to a produce stand and picked up a peach? And bugs are all over you? My friend, those little black dots are fruit flies, and believe it or not chances are that a banana is the problem. Fruit fly eggs are commonly introduced into a home by way of bananas. The simplest way to stop them from hatching in the first place is to wash your bananas when you first bring them home.

But if these tiny pests are already in your kitchen, the best way to get rid of them is to remove their food sources. A fruit fly's life cycle is 40 to 50 days, but it'll last only about a week without food. Fruit flies are drawn to the yeasts found in fruit sugars when fruit begins to ferment. So, dispose of rotten fruit immediately. And do not let ripened fruit linger on your countertops. Instead refrigerate apples, pears, peaches, and even tomatoes when they are

ready to turn. Freeze ripe bananas to use later in smoothies or baked goods.

Your recycling bin, sink, and/or garbage disposal can also be harboring the yeasts that attract fruit flies. Rinse recyclables to get rid of residual sugars and clean your sink and garbage disposal with a mixture of vinegar and either ice or baking soda.

You can also set traps for fruit flies. Put fruit juice in a small bowl covered with plastic wrap. Alternatively, grab a funnel (or make a piece of paper into a funnel) and place it at the top of a recently finished wine bottle with a few drops left. Both methods draw flies in but won't let them out. Also, you can use a small bowl of beer—and that will be even better. I worked in a grocery market, and we would use the beer method and it really works well.





Lay Servant Ministries

Have you felt God calling you to become more involved in your local church and community? Perhaps you have discerned the need to develop your leadership skills. Lay Servant Ministry courses are what you are looking for. Lay Servant Ministries courses will prepare you for a multitude of missions and ministries, or improve your teaching and leadership skills, or help you develop your ability to lead prayer.

The goal of Lay Servant Ministries is to develop church members in the areas of leadership, caring, and communication. Lay Servant Ministries is one of the most significant lay leadership development programs available within the United Methodist Church, through equipping and empowering laity to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ.

A Certified Lay Servant is a professing member of a local United Methodist Church who will become trained over time in areas to serve the church by understanding doctrine, church heritage, church organization, and the life of The United Methodist Church. This is a person who has received training to witness and evangelize about the Christian faith, through training in areas of communication, leading, and caring ministry. Certified Lay Servants serve the local church or charge and if asked can serve at other churches. Each Lay Servant's duties are different based on their gifts and call from God. Many provide program leadership or assistance, participate in worship by giving prayers or assisting in serving communion, or facilitating bible study classes. Their main goal is to aid the church pastor and provide a leadership presence within the church.

Except for online courses taken through beadisciple.com, all courses are designed as 10-hour trainings. Courses include a required text for participants and leaders, as well as a leader's guide for the facilitator of the course.



Laity are the primary agents of holy love incarnate in the world. "The witness of the laity, their Christ-like examples of everyday living as well as the sharing of their own faith experiences with the gospel, is the primary evangelistic ministry through which all people will come to know Christ and the United Methodist Church will fulfill its mission."

- **Certified Lay Servants** who wish to develop their skills further may choose a track to become certified in a more advanced area after additional training.
- **Certified Lay Speakers** are those who have the specific calling of preaching the word when requested and desire to serve in the role as pulpit supply.
- **Certified Lay Ministers** are those persons who have been called to long-term intentional ministry as part of a ministry team.

If you choose to commit to the development of your leadership skills by becoming a Lay Servant, you will be richly blessed by the network of other Lay Servants we have in our district.

The Spiritual Mirror

God's Word is a spiritual mirror. When you look into it, you see who you are in the Spirit, it always reflects (2 cor. 3:18). As you look in the mirror (God's Word) you discover your identity in Christ (who you are in the Spirit), and act on that knowledge in faith, you will see the life of God within you manifest.

If I told you your hair was messed up, how would you know if it was or not? You can't go by how it "feels." The only way you can know is to look in a mirror. Then you just believe and act accordingly. If some hairs are out of place, you comb them. You trust the mirror to tell you the truth.




However, what you see in a mirror is only a reflection, it's not the real thing. You've never really seen your face before. It's true—think about it. You might have observed your reflection in a mirror, viewed a photograph, or seen a drawing, but you've never looked directly at your own face. How do you know that these representations of your own face are accurate? Haven't you seen those funny mirrors at a circus or carnival? Everyone knows that they doctor those pictures of people in magazines at the grocery store, and drawing caricatures is even considered a form of art. Therefore, you must trust that the reflection you're seeing in the mirror is a true and accurate image.

It's the same when you look into the Spiritual mirror of God's Word. The Word tells you who you are and what you have in Christ. It reveals spiritual truths and what's happening in the spiritual world. If you want to experience life and peace, then you need to be spiritually minded.

You will never move into the supernatural things of God while being dominated by the natural realm—what you can see, taste, hear, smell, and feel. If you can't believe anything beyond what your five senses confirm, then you are carnally minded. If something must be proven scientifically in a test tube before you believe it exists, then you are trapped in the natural realm. God is a spirit, and he moves in the Spirit, and he moves in the Spirit realm (John 4:24). God is Spirit, and his worshipers must worship in Spirit and Truth.



Numbers is an oft-misunderstood book among Christians, and therefore is often overlooked. Following Leviticus, with a name that implies more rules, it actually contains quite a few great stories, which are packed in records. Numbers begins where Exodus ends, with the journeys of Israel through the wilderness. The reading can be quite engaging if the reader keeps in mind that the Hebrews were extremely accurate record keepers, both of numbers and of events. It is proof that they can be trusted to present an Old Testament that is reliable.

Some thoughts that are probably alien to you...

Are there now, or have there ever been any living, breathing aliens from “outer space” hovering around or hanging out anywhere near planet Earth?

Have there ever been flying saucers, submersible saucers, super-sonic saucers, or any irregular shaped flying devices that can move faster than any human engineered craft known to mortal man?

Have any such non-human life forms ever come to visit our Earthly home, having originated from some place out there in deep space?

Is that even possible? I don't think so. But who am I to raise the question?


Some thoughts that will make you wonder.

- What is a Light Year (LY)? It's the distance light travels in one Earth year—12 months. It's a distance, not a period of time. In Earth terms, one LY is about **6 trillion miles**.
- How big is the Milky Way Galaxy? Well, Earth is 923,330 LYs away from the outer edge of the Milky Way. So multiply $923,330 \times 6,000,000,000$ and you get **5,538,000,000,000 years to get there. (Coming or going)**
- Earth, our planet, is just 26,670 LYs from the center of the Milky Way. Multiply 26,670 LYs \times 6,000,000,000 earth miles. This distance is 900+ times greater than the distance to the center of the Milky Way. I Googled it: **160,020,000,000,000 (160,020 trillion) years**.
- Travelling at the speed of light, it would take **100,000,000 Earth years to reach the outer edge of the Milky Way**.

Because light takes a standard amount of time to travel to our eyes, everything we can view in space has already happened!
