

NIFAA Field and Hunter Championship Rules & NIFAA Bowhunter Championship Rules

- The NIFAA Field and Hunter Championships will consist of one Field Round and one Hunter Round. Each Round will have 28 targets, or 14 targets shot twice as per IFAA rules.
- The NIFAA Bowhunter Championships will consist of two different IFAA Bowhunter Rounds. Each Round will have 28 targets, or 14 targets shot twice as per IFAA rules. The types of Round shot will be at the discretion of the NIFAA Committee in liaison with the host club.
- Each competition will take place across one weekend with one Round shot per day. This rule may be set aside in exceptional circumstances with the agreement of the NIFAA Committee.
- To qualify to shoot in a NIFAA Field and Hunter or Bowhunter Championship, adults must have a minimum of four scores from Field/Hunter or Bowhunter Rounds recorded on their official classification card. At least two scores must be from the year of the Championship, the remainder must have been recorded within the previous twelve months. Previous Championship scores are allowable.
- Cubs and Juniors must have two scores from Field/Hunter or Bowhunter Rounds recorded on their official classification card. These scores must be from the year of the Championship.
- Qualifying scores may be from any combination of Field, Hunter or Bowhunter Round. For example, an archer who has recorded four scores in Field/Hunter will be permitted to enter the Bowhunter Championships and vice-versa.
- All qualifying Rounds must be recognized IFAA Rounds held under IFAA rules.
- Only scores from Rounds held in Northern Ireland by NIFAA recognised clubs will qualify.
- Any archer who does not have the required number of qualifying scores will not be eligible to hold the title of Champion or claim a Championship medal. They may be allowed to shoot at a Championship at the discretion of the organizers.
- Preference must be given to NIFAA archers who have the required number of qualifying scores.
- Only current members of NIFAA are eligible to compete for any NIFAA Championship title or other Championship medal. Members of other recognized archery associations are welcome to shoot at NIFAA Championships if space is available and they are in possession of a valid membership/classification card proving their competence.
- All entrants to any NIFAA Championship will be expected to know and comply with NIFAA and IFAA rules regarding archery. Infringement of these rules may result in an archer being disqualified from the competition and asked to leave immediately. In the event of a serious breach, particularly involving the safety of others, further sanctions may apply including loss of membership.
