

NIFAA Outdoor League Rules

- The Outdoor League will run from the date of the first qualifying event of the year until the NIFAA Bowhunter Championships of the same year. Only NIFAA members may compete in the Outdoor League, but members of other recognized archery associations are welcome to take part in individual events where space is available.
- The Outdoor League will consist of four shooting rounds for Young Adults, Adults, Veterans and Seniors. Two or three scores must be submitted from any combination of Field or Hunter Rounds, and at least one from Bowhunter. For example, three scores from Field/Hunter and one from Bowhunter, or two scores from Field/Hunter and two from Bowhunter. No more than two scores may be submitted from Bowhunter Rounds.
- Cubs and Juniors must submit two scores, one score from Field or Hunter Rounds and one from a Bowhunter Round.
- Scores from the Bowhunter Round must be from unmarked 3D Rounds of any type. Scores from unmarked/marked 2D Rounds and marked 3D Rounds will not count towards the NIFAA Outdoor League.
- Scores from the Field and Hunter Championships and the Bowhunter Championships will not count towards the NIFAA Outdoor League.
- Archers may shoot in as many events as they wish. Only their highest scores from each category will be counted. All scores must be in the same Bowstyle. The winners in each category will be decided by the total score recorded.
- If an archer fails or is unable to record a score in one of the categories, that is Field/Hunter or Bowhunter they may not substitute a score from the other category.
- Any archer who does not submit the required number of scores will not take the title of Outdoor League Champion nor will they be eligible for any medal.
- All qualifying Rounds must be recognized IFAA Rounds held under IFAA rules.
- Only scores from Rounds held in Northern Ireland by NIFAA recognised clubs will qualify.
- All entrants to any NIFAA event will be expected to know and comply with NIFAA and IFAA rules regarding archery. Infringement of these rules may result in an archer being disqualified from the competition and asked to leave immediately. In the event of a serious breach, particularly involving the safety of others, further sanctions may apply including loss of membership.
