International Outreach

Jamaica:

As a result of Hurricane Melissa, there is an urgent need in Jamaica for all types of assistance. White Oak Ministries will be passing the offerings plate on Mission Sunday, November 9 to provide financial assistance to the peoples of Jamaica. Any and all monies collected will be sent from our generous congregation here in Fredericksburg to the Global Missions Ministries. They are the missions department in our parent organization, Church of God of Prophecy. Global Missions will then work with the Bishop in Jamaica to see that the funds are distributed as they see fit since they are on the ground there and can see what the most immediate needs are.

The International Assembly reported in 2024 that there are 299 COGOP affiliated churches in Jamaica with 28,330 members. The damage is still being assessed but is obviously severe. Sister Joy is in touch with the COGOP Global Missions Ministries and will keep us all updated on the status and progress of the operations.
