About our musical theatre program

At New York All Stars, we believe that theatre promotes essential life skills and should be available and accessible to all kids. When your child registers with New York All Stars, they are guaranteed a role in the show. Actors will be considered for all roles regardless of gender, race, ethnicity, disability, or physical appearance. We aim to set them up for success by giving them the role in which they will have the best opportunity to shine in the performance. Students will audition for role placement during the first few weeks of classes. After registering, you will receive materials for them to prepare at home.

Our Musical Theatre program consists of two separate casts - you may register for one or both, but actors are not guaranteed the same role in both.

*Excat performance schedules will be shared after casting. Please make sure your actor is fully available for both weekends and communicate any potential conflicts immediately.

Spring Musical (Tentatively SpongeBob Musical - Youth Edition) Rehearses Feb. 2nd- June 10th Performances June 18th-20th

Rehearsal Groups

Each group rotates between vocal, acting and choreography studios. Actors will typically rehearse with their age group and/or ensemble.

K-1st Graders: Mondays or Wednesdays 4:00-5:00pm 2nd-4th Graders: Mondays or Wednesdays 4:00-6:00pm 5th-8th Graders: Mondays or Wednesdays 4:00-6:00pm

Tech Week and Performance Location: Whippoorwill Hall at North Castle Library 19 Whippoorwill Rd. E., Armonk, NY.

Tech Week: There will be at least two mandatory dress / tech rehearsals on stage for each cast during the weeks prior to the musical. Detailed schedule to follow. Tech week rehearsals and attendance at all performances are required!

Payment Policies

- 1. Tuition must be paid in full to complete your registration and begin classes. Tuition is non-refundable. The only instance in which tuition will be refunded is if New York All Stars cancels a class for the semester due to low enrollment in a specific class, program or age group.
- 2. Tuition is not pro-rated, refunded or credited when there is a scheduled closure OR when classes are canceled due to inclement weather or other circumstances beyond our control including but not limited to: a public health emergency, a safety or mechanical issue, natural disaster, etc.
- 3. If New York All Stars must cancel a class due to instructor illness, every effort will be made to make up the class. If there are more than two cancelations in a single semester and the class(es) cannot be made up, a credit will be applied to your family's account for future use.
- 4. Families on monthly payment plans must have a credit card on file. There is a \$30 administrative fee to enroll in a monthly payment plan. Your card will be charged on the 25th of each month for the upcoming month's tuition. Please note monthly tuition is an option for fulfilling the entire semester's tuition commitment. It is not a month-to-month enrollment option. You are responsible for the full amount of tuition.
- 5. There shall be a \$35 fee automatically assessed for any returned or declined transaction.
- 6. Students with an outstanding balance on their account are not allowed to attend classes, rehearsals or performances.

New York All Stars Program Policies

Class Guidelines: Your tuition guarantees you the opportunity to train and rehearse with New York All Stars. Adhering to the guidelines below guarantees your child's right to perform. Students with excessive absences and/or who are not prepared for the performance within two weeks of the show, may be at risk of removal or replacement in the show. A successful production requires commitment from all members to the following guidelines.

- 1. **Be Prepared:** Students should be prepared and on time for every scheduled rehearsal or event. This includes proper attire, hair away from the face, water and **script!** Additional materials may be required depending on the class.
- 2. **Attendance**: Please communicate in advance if your child will be late or miss a class. You can log an expected absence in your Parent Portal the link is available on our website: www.newyorkallstars.org Excessive absences may result in removal or replacement in a role.
- 3. Classes are drop-off, except for invited performances. Parents who are more than 15 minutes late for pick-up may be subject to a \$15 late pick up fee to cover the cost of our staff's overtime.
- 4. What to wear: Comfortable athletic or dance wear and jazz shoes. Preferably slip on in black or tan.
- 5. **During classes:** No food, No Gum, No Phones (unless the device is used for instruction/music/research under the supervision of a teacher)
- 6. **No side-coaching:** Parents should try to avoid coaching children during classes or performances. Our staff will provide guidance for how to help your child practice at home.
- 7. **At Home Practice:** We provide extensive resources and guidance for what can be practiced at home, including a required app and deadlines for memorizing material. Kids will likely need support at home with learning lines and accessing practice materials.
- 7. **NYAS** is an *inclusive program* and will always make an effort to accommodate students with learning and behavioral differences or physical conditions, however we require clear communication of your child's condition and needs. Please clarify any special needs, upon registration to ensure we are properly prepared to instruct your child. All members must be able to commit to our Community Standards as described below:

If you have a concern, issue, or complaint, we ask that you approach it respectfully and privately —never in the presence of other families or students. We take all concerns seriously and are here to support you. Please email your concern or request a phone call or meeting with an administrator or teacher. Failure to uphold these Community Standards—by a student or any member of their family—may result in immediate removal from the program without a refund.
