



Succulent Garden Wall 101: Build Your Own Living Art

Materials Needed

- Woolly Pocket vertical planter frame
- Mounting screws and wall anchors
- Drill and level
- AZWF raised bed mix
- Small succulents or cutting
- Scoop or small trowel
- Rain shower hose wand

Step-by-Step Instructions

1. Choose the location
Select a wall that receives bright light but protection from intense afternoon sun.
2. Install the mounting hardware
Use a level to mark where the frame will hang. Drill holes and install anchors if needed.
3. Mount the frame
Secure the Woolly Pocket frame firmly to the wall with screws.
4. Pre-moisten the soil
Lightly moisten the succulent soil so it is damp but not soggy.
5. Fill the pockets
Open each fabric pocket and fill about $\frac{3}{4}$ full with soil. Lightly press the soil so it stays in place.
6. Prepare the plants
Remove succulents from nursery pots and gently shake off excess soil.
7. Plant the succulents
Use your finger or a pencil to make a small hole in the soil. Insert the roots or stem cutting and gently firm soil around the plant.
8. Design the layout
Place trailing succulents in the lower pockets and rosette or upright plants toward the top.

9. Water the wall

Water slowly from the top row so water filters through the pockets below.

Care Tips

- Water about every 5-7 days depending on heat and sunlight.
- Use small plants or cuttings so the pockets don't become overcrowded.
- Trim plants as they grow and replace any that don't establish.
- Provide afternoon shade and slightly more frequent watering during the summer.
