

The Present Simple

Use

The present simple is used to talk about things you do every day and things you like and don't like.

Form

When speaking you can use short forms

do not	→	don't
does not	→	doesn't

In a positive sentence the form looks like this:

I	like	K-Pop
You	live	in Manchester
We	eat	fish
They		
She	likes	K-Pop
He	lives	in Manchester
It	eats	fish

In a negative sentence the form looks like this:

I		like	K-Pop
You	don't	live	in Manchester
We		eat	fish
They			
She		likes	K-Pop
He	doesn't	live	in Manchester
It		eats	fish

In a question the form looks like this:

Do	I You We They	Like K-Pop? Smoke?
Does	He She It	Eat meat?

To answer the form looks like this:

	I You We They	do		I You We They	don't
Yes	He She It	does		He She It	doesn't

NOTE:

Add an 's' to the verb for *he, she* and *it*

Example

I live in Manchester

He *lives* in Manchester

Do you live in Manchester?

Does he live in Manchester
