Use

<i>Use have got to talk about:</i>	
	<i>Example</i>
Families	I <i>have got</i> two sisters
Illnesses	I <i>have got</i> a sore throat
Things you own	I <i>have got</i> a new jacket
Describe places	The park <i>has got</i> a lot of trees

Form

When speaking you can use short forms

I have	→	I've
I have not	→	I haven't
She has got	→	She's got
They have not	→	They haven't
He has not got	→	He hasn't got

In a positive sentence the form looks like this:

I	've got (have got)	a small garden an exam tomorrow a pet dog two cousins

She	's got (has got)

In a negative sentence the form looks like this:

I	haven't got (have not got)	a small garden an exam tomorrow a pet dog two cousins

She	hasn't got (has not got)	
He

In a question the form looks like this:

Have	I You We They	got	a small garden an exam tomorrow a pet dog two cousins
Has	He She It		

To answer the form looks like this:

Yes	I You We They	have	No	I You We They	haven't (have not)
	He She It	has		He She It	hasn't (has not)
