
Verb + ing

Use

You use the verb + *ing* when you talk about *liking or disliking* something. Verb + *ing* is also used when asking about liking or disliking something When you use the phrase *'be good at'*, you follow it with a noun or the *verb +ing*. When you use the verb *'mind'*, you also follow it with verb +*ing*
