

# Giving advice: *should*

## Use

Giving advice is when you suggest actions to other people.

The word *should* is often used as a way of asking for and offering advice.

## Form

*Should* is a modal verb. It is followed by the infinitive of the main verb without *to*.

	<i>Should</i>	<i>Infinitive of the verb</i>
Sentence	<i>You <b>should</b></i>	<i>study more</i>
Negative	<i>Louisa <b>shouldn't</b></i>	<i>stay up so late.</i>
Question	<i><b>Should</b> I</i>	<i>Ask the builder for help?</i>

*Should* is a modal verb which does not change form

	First person	Second person	Third person
Singular	<i>I <b>should</b> go.</i>	<i>You <b>should</b> go.</i>	<i>He/She <b>should</b> go.</i>
Plural	<i>We <b>should</b> go.</i>	<i>You <b>should</b> go.</i>	<i>They <b>should</b> go.</i>
