Using will for future arrangements

Use

will is used to talk about an arrangement which is about to happen or is in the very near future, to make a promise or to offer to do something for someone or to ask someone to do something.

The negative of will is won't (will not). Use won't when refusing to do something

Form

will is a modal verb. It is followed by the infinitive of the main verb without to.will does not change its form according to person or singular and plural.

When speaking the contracted form of '|| or won't is used
