Dear Fellow MCRN Members.

We launched the Municipal Cannabis Regulators Network (MCRN) after one of the key findings of the 2022 Michigan Local Government Marijuana Review Process Survey (MRPS) revealed that local government cannabis regulations officials expressed more training and professional development opportunities need to be made available to municipal cannabis regulators. The MRPS gathers the opinions and perspectives of local government cannabis regulators on a variety of important cannabis related issues facing their municipalities.

MCRN is working to build a positive and supportive community among local government marijuana administrators in Michigan. MCRN focuses primarily on its member's professional development, competency-based education, sharing of best practices and networking.

Since we launched MCRN earlier this year:

- We had regulators join from 31 different municipalities across the state.
 The cities of Battle Creek, Bay City, Big Rapids, Center Line, Clare,
 Coldwater, Coleman, Crystal Falls, Detroit, Grand Rapids, Hartford,
 Hazel Park, Highland Park, Madison Heights, Manistee, Marshall,
 Mount Pleasant, Pontiac, Reading, Roseville, Sturgis, Swartz Creek &
 White Cloud. The townships of Arlington, Emmett, Lawrence and
 Vassar. The villages of Barryton, Constantine, Leonard and Quincy.
- 2. Designed and launched a website for the professional development and sharing of best practices for municipal cannabis regulators https://municannabis.org/.
- 3. Established a partnership with the Cannabis Center for Municipalities. The Cannabis Center is a technical assistance resource center for cities, townships and villages that regulate medical and/or recreational marijuana. The Center conducts, administers and/or sponsors research that focuses on municipal cannabis regulations, policies, leadership and economic benefits. The Center promotes best practices for local government cannabis regulators.
- 4. Developed a membership survey to ensure we are meeting the needs of our members.

We encourage you to tell your fellow local government marijuana administrators about MCRN and see if they would like to join our growing network.

MCRN announces partnership with the Cannabis Center for Municipalities

The Cannabis Center for Municipalities is a technical assistance resource center for cities, townships and villages that regulate medical and/or recreational marijuana. The Cannabis Center promotes local government cannabis regulations best practices. The Cannabis Center conducts, administers and/or sponsors research that focuses on municipal cannabis regulations, policies, leadership and economic benefits.

The Cannabis Center offers membership opportunities to municipalities. When a city, township, or village joins the Center, everyone involved in marijuana regulations in the municipality from policy makers to staff are given access to center resources, such as research reports, policy briefs and discounted technical assistance services.

MCRN is excited about this partnership because it gives the network access to a research and technical assistance center partner. As a part of the partnership, MCRN members were given a one-time complementary membership that expires on December 31, 2023. Until the end of the year, MCRN members will have free access to the Cannabis Center research reports and policy briefs. Also, the Center will offer discounted technical assistance services to MCRN members. In addition, Cannabis Center municipality members were given a complementary membership in MCRN for their municipality primary cannabis regulators.

In order to continue taking advantage of the Cannabis Center resources starting in 2024, the municipality that MCRN members represent will have to become a member of the Center.

What makes this a great partnership is MCRN focuses on the professional development, competency-based education and the sharing of best practices for local government cannabis regulators. On the other hand, the Cannabis Center focuses on being a research and technical assistance resource center for cities, townships and villages. The Cannabis Center priority is being a resource to the municipality while MCRN priority is the professional development of the primary cannabis regulator in a community.

cannabis prohibition and enforcement.


They discussed program designs, implementation and/or redesign phases. They share successes, failures and best practices emerging around the nation.
