21-351 **Resolution to approve expenditure of allocated funds for the purpose of the Pontiac Skate Park Project**. Moved by Councilperson Waterman and second by Councilperson Taylor-Burks.

Whereas, the Pontiac Skate Park Project was awarded \$250,000 in matching funds for the construction of a free public skate park in addition to \$50,000 to fund project design costs that specifically intend to lessen the environmental impact of the skate park.

Whereas, the Oakland County Sheriff Police Athletic League is the acting fiduciary for the Pontiac Skate Park Project.

Whereas, the grant requires matching funds to secure the \$250,000 from the Skate Park Project.

Whereas, with matching funds acquired, the Pontiac Skate Park Project could construct a 10,000 square foot skate park by November 2022.

Whereas, with \$70,000 raised by the Pontiac Skate Park Project, \$250,000 in matching awards from the Skate Park Project, addition to \$50,000 to fund project design costs that specifically intend to lessen the environmental impact of the Skate Park, and \$180,000 allocated by the City of Pontiac there would be a total of \$550,000 established for the family.

Whereas, the City of Pontiac would allocate to the Pontiac Skate Park Project \$180,000 from its FY 2021-2022 Budget.
