I am deliberately leaving out other functions to simplify the message and solely focusing on the UI/UX and test functions. It does not mean that they will have to be left out.


## **Background**

I have worked on projects where test and UX were involved together at the beginning of the project where the delivery of the project resulted in high-quality work. In instances where the teams where siloed, this resulted in miscommunication that resulted in errors at every subsequent stage. Conversely, involving UX/UI functions during the testing phase can help with teething out any usability issues.

### The test function

#### The test function will be able to:

- Give input on error conditions and ask what the software should do in those instances.
- Apply their systems knowledge as users and give feedback on whether functionality will hinder users of the software.
- Ask detailed questions in meetings to gain a better understanding when it comes to testing the software or write test documentation.
- Review design documentation to ensure there are no ambiguities.



#### The UI/UX function

#### UI/UX function will be able to:

 Work with testers when testing to ensure the functionality meets their original vision.



- Fill in gaps where the test engineer's knowledge of how the software should behave under certain conditions.
- Review test documentation, test cases, charters, diagrams, etc., to ensure test engineers have fully understood their designs.
- Create and apply usability tests to capture usability issues.
