

This is the default screen. Click at the bottom left to open the menu.




Click on "Internet" and then on "Firefox" to launch the web browser.

Firefox will open to the log library's home page. Click on MCGL in the menu.











At the MCGL opening screen, click on "Sign In"








This is the main MCGL search screen.








Here we've clicked on the diamond line headers for several wells to see available data




We've also clicked several selection boxes for different logs. Now click the preview icon.


You can preview up to four logs at a time




Align the logs so the depths match, then click the Sync Scrolls button to scroll all at once






To copy off your images, click on the Files icon (or find Files in the menu)




The file explorer window will open. Most saved images wind up in the Pictures folder
