Impress your friends by printing and stamping tea towels, or other fabric items, to give as gifts or to keep. Alternatively print fabric to make other items or applique to other items such a scarf, use for furoshiki wrapping cloths, for quilting projects, to turn it into a hanging art piece, create fabric journal covers or embellish bags.

With a range of stencils and lino blocks to chose from you will be able to create your own personalised items. Alternatively you can bring along stencils or linos you've created before, and/or combine these with the others that are available to use.

Slow down and enjoy creating items yourself that are printed and decorated by hand! These items are sure to be treasured far more than a mass produced items and you'll have the pleasure of knowing that you created them yourself.
