NORTHERN ARIZONA FIRE DISTRICT (NAFD) BURN PERMIT STIPULATIONS

1. Must own property or have letter of authorization to burn by the owner; **permit must be present when burning.**
2. Fire shall be under constant supervision by the responsible individual until completely extinguished.
3. Wind speed must be under 10 m.p.h. Fire District may order burning suspended if wind increases.
4. Must have water under pressure.
5. Burning will be permitted **one hour after sunrise** and must be extinguished **two hours before sunset.**
6. Start the fire using items that do not cause the production of black smoke.
7. Materials **permitted** to burn with an Open Burning Permit:
 - Brush, Grass, Crop, Weeds, Untreated wood/lumber, Tree clippings
8. Types of materials you are **NOT permitted** to burn with an Open Burning Permit:
 - **All plastic materials:** bottles for household chemicals, water bottles, grocery and retail bags
 - **Waste Petroleum Products:** waste crankcase oil, used oil, transmission oil, oil filters
 - **Hazardous Materials Products or Haz-Mat Containers containing the following:** mercury compounds, pesticides, lead compounds, cleaners, stains, varnishes, cadmium compounds, paints, arsenic compounds
 - **Other items not permitted:** explosives, ammunition, antifreeze, treated landscape timber, poison oak, electrical wire insulation, trash, garbage, household waste, oleanders, pressure treated lumber, thermal insulation, polyester, poison sumac, asphalt shingles, railroad ties, flammable liquids, tar paper, batteries, aerosol spray cans, tires, asbestos, poison ivy
9. Area must be clear of overhead obstructions/hazards with a minimum 25ft clearance around the burn site and at least 50ft from any structure.
10. Burn permits may be revoked if emissions from the fires create excessive smoke, air pollutions, a public nuisance or safety hazard.
11. Burning may be suspended at any time by NAFD Duty Chief or his designee.

In accordance with A.R.S. § 49-501 and the Standard Operation Procedures of the Northern Arizona Fire District this permit has been granted. The applicant agrees to comply with the intent of the regulations outlined by the NAFD Burn Permit Stipulations listed above. This permit is issued and accepted on the condition that all regulations now adopted, or that may hereafter be adopted, shall be complied with to the full extent and may not be transferable. This permit is valid only for the time and conditions prescribed and must be validated by NAFD to be effective.

I have read and I agree to all the NAFD Burn Permit Stipulations listed above. I also understand that failure to comply with these stipulations can result in my burn permit being revoked. I further agree to extinguish when ordered by the Fire District representative.
