## **Summary**

If you already have a solid family plan in place there should be some new ideas you have not considered. I have also removed firearms from this document to make this a neutral list to fit both conservative and liberal political views. In general, if you are prepared for a three day power outage, geographic natural disasters, a home invasion, car jacking attempt, and communication with your family and friends if cell phones and the internet are not working you can handle most every other common emergency.
