Winter Reminder

With winter fast approaching, the Township would like to remind the residents to please not push snow onto the road and not park your vehicle on the township road or right-of-way. This causes a safety issue for motorists and the road department's ability to maintain the road.

If a vehicle is parked on the roadway or right-of-way, a letter will be sent to the property owner requesting not to park on the roadway. If the parking continues, the township will bring the issue before the district magistrate.

Kindly help Summit Township provide safe driving conditions all year long with not parking on the roadway or right-of-way. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

The 12 Days of Safety

1. Never use candles near trees or boughs.
2. Keep poisonous plants out of reach of children and pets.
3. Keep trees away from fireplaces, radiators and other heat sources
4. Make sure your tree has a stable platform.
5. Choose an artificial tree that is labeled fire resistant.
6. If using a natural tree, make sure it well watered.
7. Check holiday lights for fraying, bare spots, gaps in the insulation or excessive kinking in the wire.
8. Turn off all tree lights and decorations when not in use.
9. When putting up decorations, use a step stool or ladder to reach high places.
10. Designate a sober driver.
11. When preparing a meal, wash hands, utensils, sink and anything else that touches raw meat.
12. Reheat leftovers to at least 165°F.
