


Royal Farms is Coming Soon to Currituck County

The place famous for full gas tanks and full buckets of chicken is making its way to North Carolina. That's right! Currituck County is welcoming **Royal Farms**, the Baltimore-based convenience store, into our state for the first time.


Since 1959, the quick & friendly stores have been known for serving up "fast and fresh" hot foods (like fried chicken, subs, and burgers), pumping out all sorts of automotive fuel (gas, diesel, and electric charging stations), and providing the typical grab 'n' go items—24 hours a day.

Royal Farms currently operates 247 locations, and up until this point, North Carolinians could only enjoy them on road trips through states like Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia. But, soon enough, there'll be one just down the street!





The first ever North Carolina location will occupy a 5.3 acre lot at the corner of Walnut Island Boulevard and Caratoke Highway in Grandy. Most recently, this property featured a gift shop, called **Nuts & Buds**, which is moving to a larger building further up the road (per the company's Facebook).

Compared to other Royal Farms locations, this site is quite large—big enough to accommodate nearly 70 parking spaces and 8 gas pumps.



Currituck County, along with the Grandy community, is greeting Royal Farms with much excitement.

"We certainly appreciate Royal Farms' commitment to Currituck county and the value they see in bringing their first Royal Farms site ever into North Carolina," said Currituck County Economic Development Director **Larry Lombardi**. "In addition, what's not to like about their World-Famous Royal Farms Chicken?"

Among other things, the county is happy to hear that this new Royal Farms location will add 35-40 jobs to the community, once it's up and running.

As to when we can expect this exciting new shop to open its doors, the original county approval documents planned for a January start date. However, construction projects, like this one, typically come with fluid and flexible time frames.

Exact dates aside, it won't be long before the Tar Heel State get its first taste of Royal Farms.
