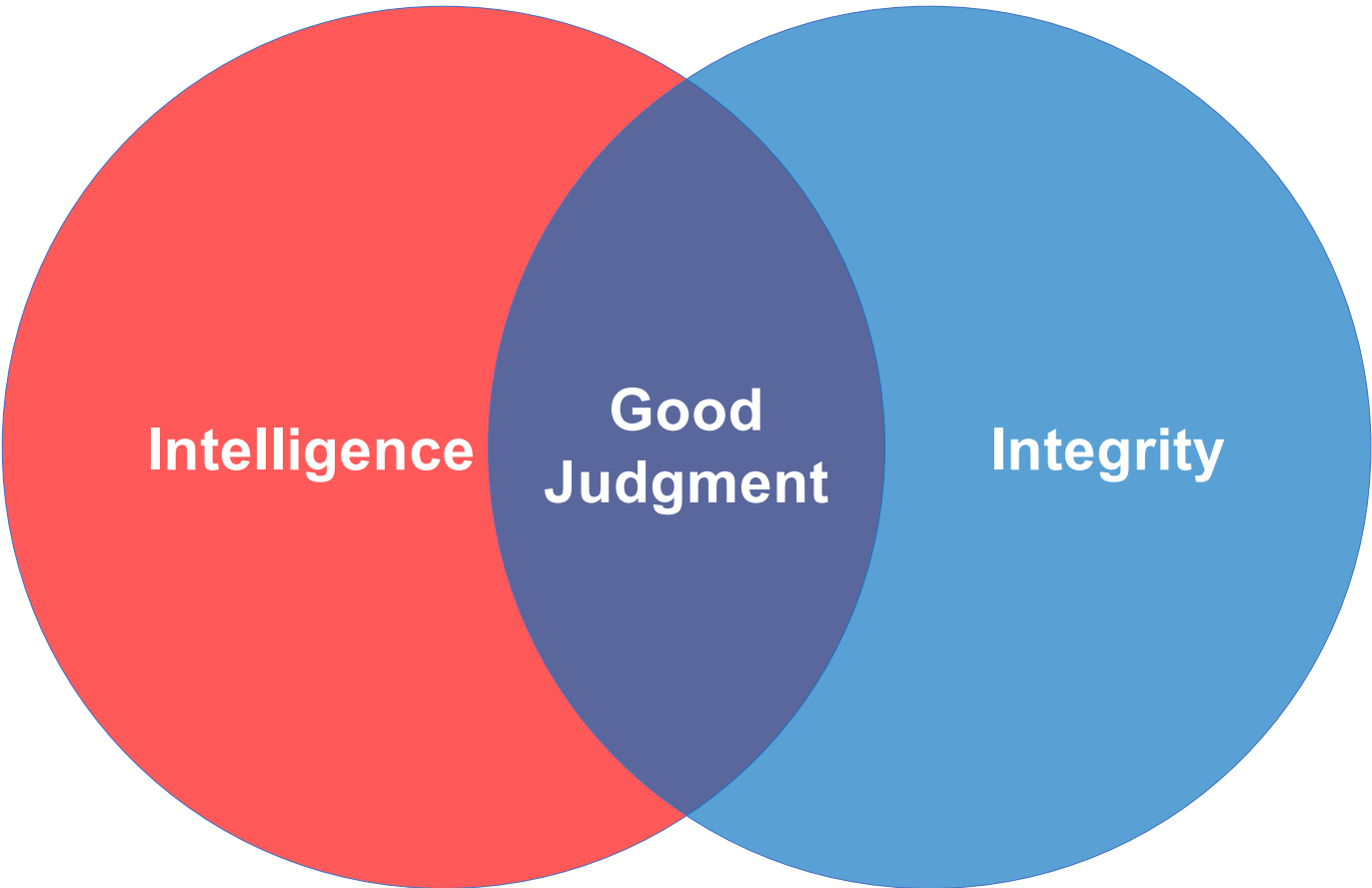

High Integrity	“Good-hearted”	Good Judgment



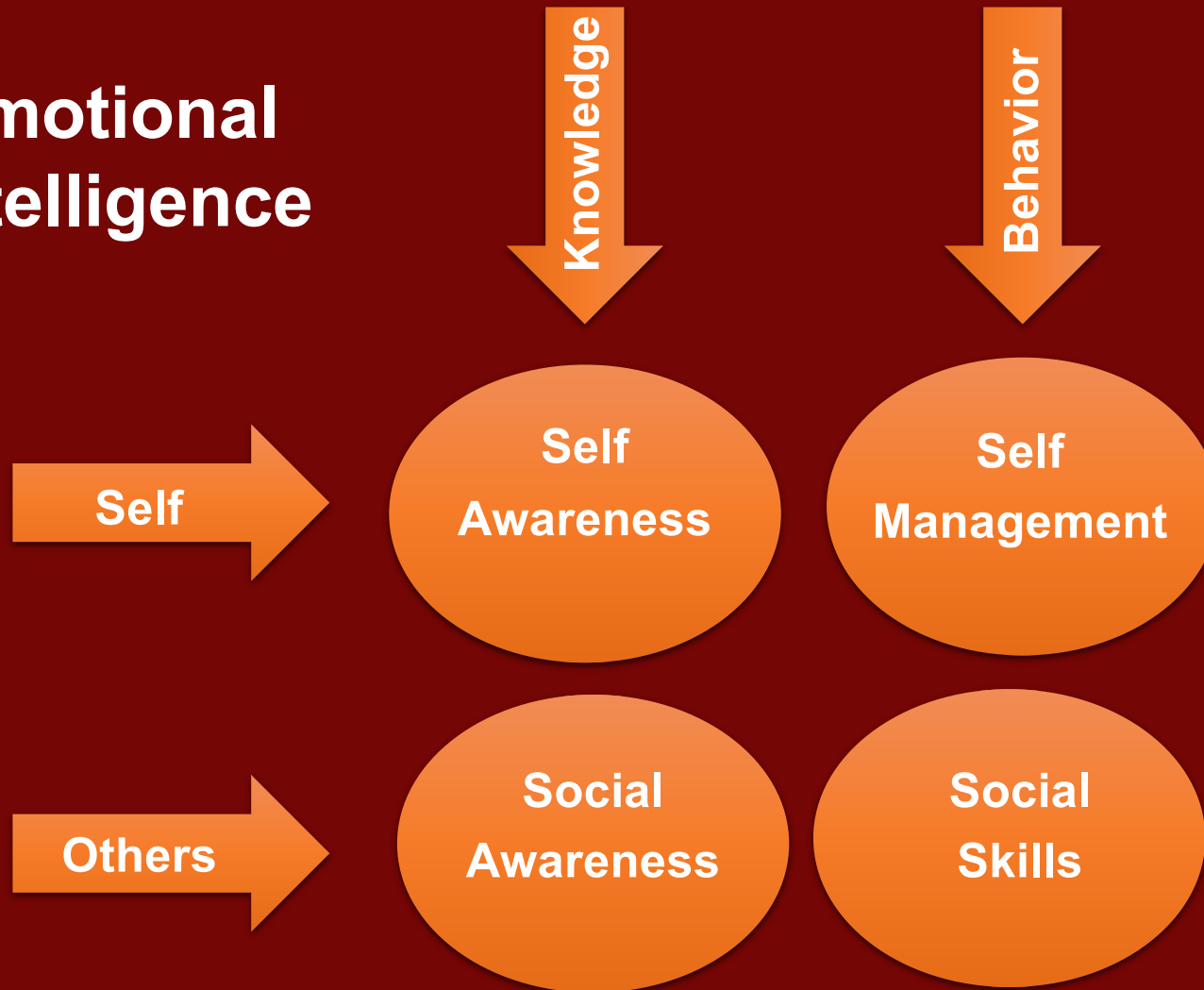
