






We saw that God's Word says He knows our thoughts before we think them and that He knows our hearts as well.





An in immersive study to experience the birth of Messiah!

The birth of Jesus is a wholly orchestrated event! All the pieces we looked at in parts 1 & 2 and the pieces in this lesson will come together and hopefully give you an impactful understanding of the fact that all of this is one amazing event and not just several different events not fully related!



It is important to understand that during the time of Jesus birth, the Jewish nation was eagerly awaiting a savior to free them from the bondage of the Romans and their history of being conquered. Roman historians Suetonius, Tacitus, and Josephus all wrote that everybody was talking expectedly about a ruler coming from Judea to rule the world. There was a buzz about all throughout the land!

The PROPHESIED Birth of the Son of God!

Luke 1:5-80 ~ we see the build up to the birth of Jesus; Zacharias is visited by an angel, Gabriel, who tells him he will have a son (even though he and his wife Elizabeth are old)- this son would be John the Baptist who would be full of the spirit and proclaim the way for Jesus! 6 months after Elizabeth becomes pregnant, Mary is visited by Gabriel and is told she will become pregnant with the Son of God. Elizabeth and Mary are cousins and rejoice together in the news! HOW AWESOME THAT MUST HAVE BEEN FOR THEM AND THEIR FAMILIES!

Read Luke 1:5-17 & Luke 1:26-33

Read Matthew 1:18-25 ~ tells us about how God involves Joseph in this miraculous birth

Read Luke 2:1-20 ~describes the birth of Jesus and the announcement spread throughout the land by the shepherds

- **♦** Intersting notes:
 - ★ The Greek word for "inn" in Luke 2:7 is 'kataluma' which means a room in a guest house or inn. In Luke 22:11 the same word is used to describe a room in a residence.
 - ★ Jesus was born and wrapped in <u>swaddling cloths</u> (protective cloths) and laid in a manger (trough, feed holder, open box).
 - ★ Shepherds, lowly or highly regarded? Some insight will add some extra meaning and insight into the event!



Shepherds: low class or high society?

Some theologians believe that the shepherds were considered the lowest of the low, only group below them are the lepers. OUCH! That is low for this time period. Lepers were considered unclean outcasts; they had to announce they were lepers as they walked near anybody and had to stay outside the city. They were looked down on and kind of the 'forgotten scum' of the time. What might be one reason God would call on this lowly group to spread the news of the birth of Jesus?

Some theologians argue that the shepherds were considered to be of some reverence, high in the class system. King David, Abraham, Moses, Amos were all shepherds. And Jesus was the 'Shepherd of His people."

So, which is correct? This is one of those things we talked about before in translations of the Bible. THE PLAIN MESSAGE IS THE MAIN MESSAGE! AND That is, The Angel told the shepherds (who as we will see are humble people whether low class or high class), they worshipped the Lord, they were chosen by God to reveal the birth, AND they spread the good news!

BUT, let's study this part of the story with some historical background!

The Shepherds story and the symbolism that magnifies Jesus' birth:

1) The Mishnah (collection of rabbinic sayings, traditions, and interpretations of the OT that were written down in this book) and Babylonian Talmud (book of Rabbi debates on contents of the Mishnah) states the regulation for shepherds that "expressly forbids the keeping of flocks throughout the land of Israel except in the wilderness - and the only flocks otherwise kept would be those for the Temple services (Bab k. 7:7:80a). Sooo, since these shepherds were not in the wilderness but outside the city of Bethlehem, they were likely priests watching over flocks used for temple sacrifices and services. These sheep had to be 'unblemished lambs with no broken bones' (Read Exodus 12:3-14 The Passover; a representation of the blood covenant of Iesus)

2) The Mishnah also states that the MESSIAH would be revealed from the Midgal Eder, which translates as 'tower of the flock.' These shepherds actually had towers built in the fields (as did farmers) to watch over their flock of unblemished lambs~ like a look out tower. Wow, pretty cool stuff! Do you see how the Jewish customs make the birth that much more powerful?

The Shepherds story and the symbolism that magnifies Jesus' birth (cont'd.):

- 3) The priests would have known about the prophecy of Messiah. Now with His birth, there would not be a need for blood sacrifices of animals—they could leave their posts. Jesus was the perfect unblemished lamb

 See 1 Peter 1:19
- 4)The baby Jesus was wrapped in swaddling cloths. Swaddling cloths were not ordinary cloths. They were used by shepherds to wrap around the unblemished lambs to protect them and keep them clean for sacrifice in the temple! Say What? Does that help you understand the magnitude of the birth of Jesus?
- 5) WHAT DO YOU THINK IT WAS LIKE WHEN THE HEAVENLY HOST APPEARED TO THE SHEPHERDS? DO you think they also joined in singing and praising? Do you think they were afraid or amazed or excited or bewildered? Can you imagine the beauty of the event?

Whether the shepherds were lowly or highly is really of no consequence- Jesus was born and He is Messiah. (The main message is the plain message).

BUT if they were lowly, it adds to the humbleness and humanity of our Savior Jesus Christ.

If the shepherds were highly, then knowing the insight into the priestly shepherds adds to the impact of the event with little nuances like the watch tower or swaddling cloths.

My opinion is that the shepherds were both humble and lowly as well as highly and priestly~ take them together and the event is impacted greatly!

The role of the Wisemen in the birth of Jesus:

Read Matthew 2:1–12 ~ the wise men (Magi) are lead to Jesus: we really don't know much about the Magi-only what is in these verses. The magi were typically priestly-political class of the Parthians who lived east of Palestine. Typically magi were students of science, agriculture, history, astronomy and astrology (which were often studied together at the time). And they often dabbled in the occult yet believed in only one God. Historians say that the magi's teachings were essential to one being crowned king in Persia. AND that the magi had to approve and crown the king. They are mentioned in the books of Daniel, Esther, Jeremiah.

Many traditions and legends have settled into that there were 3 named Casper, Balthazar, and Melchior. One is pictured as Ethiopian as well. But none of this is written in the Bible. May have been descendants of Noah's son Shem.

The Magi cont'd.:


We do not know what star they followed. Maybe it was the North star, maybe it was a great star God put in the sky, maybe it was the light of God as mentioned often in the Bible. Whatever it was, it was unique and amazing! Numbers 24:17 states the Messiah is "a star (that) shall come forth from Jacob" `another WOW moment! {also in Revelation 22:16 Jesus refers to Himself as "the bright morning star"}

But the plain message is that the Magi were lead by God to follow a star to find Jesus and to worship Him as King!

The gifts the Magi brought:

GOLD~ symbol of material value and wealth AND of nobility/ royalty FRANKINCENSE~ costly beautiful smellin incense used for important occasions (used in The Temple as symbol of people desiring to please God)

MYRRH~ costly perfume often used in preparing body for burial; thus symbol of being human/ mortal



Do you see it now! ALL of it goes together like a puzzle~ each piece can be looked at individually. BUT the full picture is seen when it is all fit together into one big picture.

God loves us and created us, but before He did all this, He knew our hearts and thoughts. He knew we would rebel and sin. Yet still, He created EVERYTHING as a home for us where He could commune with us. AND ALL ALONG he made a way for us to come back to Him and be forgiven of our sins. He gave us a Messiah, a Savior!
