- 1. Know who your U.S. Senators, Congressional Representatives, etc. etc.
- 2. Be a registered voter and EXERCISE THAT RIGHT.
- 3. Know who your local officials are and talk to them about issues.
- 4. Know your elected Women of Today Officers (State and National).
- 5. Participant in a State Governmental Recognition Day (i.e. Statehood Day)
- 6. Work on a Women of Today or state political campaign.
- 7. Run for an elected office in Women of Today or other organization.
- 8. Participate in your political party's activities.
- 9. Speak at a local Women of Today meeting on a current issue.
- 10. Help promote a local Bond Issue.
- 11. Attending a local City or Town Council meeting and give a report.
- 12. Keep current on issues of concern to your community (zoning, etc.)
- 13. Take part in voter registration project.
- 14. Organize, participate in, or attend a candidate's caucus.
- 15. Attend a State Women of Today Convention/Board Meeting.
- 16. Invite a public official to speak at your local meeting.
- 17. Write a letter to one of your elected representatives.
- 18. Organize or participate in a civic ceremony in your community.
- 19. Contact your local officials and ask them to declare a proclamation for Women of Today Week.
- 20. Have local authorities go over City Ordinances and procedures with which your chapter should be familiar. (e.g.: fire laws, bingo rules).
- 21. Read a newspaper or watch the news daily.
- 22. Visit your State Legislature during session and report on a topic.
- 23. Help with transportation for the elderly to the polls.
- 24. Participate in a public debate over current local issues.
