













We are still looking for positions on the USWT staff for next year. Let me know if you have questions or would like to know any information.

Hi Women of Today Members!

Thank you to all that sent me your Bylaws and Policies this year. I appreciate all the support I've received from all of you. You made my position easier. I had a wonderful year and hope you all did as well.

Have you decided what you will be doing as your next step in Women of Today for the 2025-2026 year. Most of us are getting ready to hold our elections for the new year. Your nominations for your new State and Chapter Boards. Below is information that can help with your elections.

BYLAWS AND YOUR STATE/CHAPTER ELECTIONS!

Voting on Nominations

If all nominations are completed at once, you can use a single ballot to vote for all offices, this is a faster ballot vote than doing each office separately.

The tellers then tally the votes, and the results are given to the chair to announce. If there is an office where there was no majority, the chair announces, "no election" and another ballot is done. For offices where a majority was won, the chair announces the winner. Balloting continues until someone has won the majority of votes.

We have four bylaws and six policies that will be voted on at National Year End Meeting in Duluth. The policies will be voted on at the Board of Directors meeting and the bylaws will be voted on at the Business meeting. The motions are listed below:

Bylaw motions:

I move that we delete the wording in Article II, Section 1, which states, "The purpose of this corporation shall be to encourage, foster and support the growth and establishment of the U.S. Women of Today state and local member chapters," relocate to Article I and renumber as Section 7 and replace with:

Mission, Vision, Benefits

- A. Mission Statement
 - "Our mission is to provide opportunities in the areas of community service, leadership training, personal growth and work in partnerships with multiple charities."
- **B.** Vision Statement
 - "We are passionate people of action... Empowering individuals to make a difference in their lives and communities."
- C. Benefits Statement

Benefits from participating in Women of Today:

- . United in our vison to make a difference through service and community involvement
- Enrich and empower women in our communities
- Foster a welcoming and inclusive social experience
- Women gain confidence to lead
- · Creating supportive connections as we develop lifelong friendships.

I move that we relocate Article II, Section 2, which states, "This organization shall be non-partisan and non-sectarian. It shall wholly abstain from any political affiliation or endorsement of candidates for political office and be dedicated solely to performing functions affecting the civic, educational, recreational, and social interests of the community, state, and nation," to Article I and renumber as Section 8.

I move that we remove the word PURPOSE from ARTICLE II PURPOSE AND CREED to read: ARTICLE II CREED.

I move that we change Article II Section 3 to be titled **Article II CREED.**

Policy motions:

I move that we amend Policy 2, Section 1.B. by adding the words 'a' and 'Program Managers' so that it reads: The internal programming area shall have a Wellness and Personal Development Program Manager.

I move that we amend Policy 2, Section 3.C.1.A. to read Writing Competition \$5.00.

I move that we add Policy 2, Section 3.C.3. to read **Minimum of three (3) competitors for Speaking and Writing competitions.**

I move that we remove Board of Directors and replace with Executive Committee in Policy 13, Section 1.A.5. so that it reads: Dues Billing Contract Committee will make a recommendation for dues billing provider to the **Executive Committee** for approval at the National Mid-Year Meeting.

I move that we remove Board of Directors and replace with Executive Committee and add the word National in Policy 13, Section 2.A.5. so that it reads: Webmaster Contract Committee will make a recommendation for Webmaster to the **Executive Committee** for approval at the **National** Mid-Year Meeting.

I move that we replace the words 'the following rates' with 'budgeted amounts', and remove the specific dollar amounts in Policy 12, Section 3.D. so that it reads: Room reimbursements shall be paid at **budgeted amounts**, proportional to available funds at year end.

It has been my privilege to serve as the USWT PR Director and as a part of USWTW President Jane's staff! I have had so much fun writing up Facebook posts, talking with so many of you and meeting new members from across our organization. To my state contacts many thanks for sharing chapter/state newsletters, turning in your paperwork, and supporting the area of public relations! Thank you for "buzzing" PR throughout your communities and inviting people to join us as we empower individuals to make a difference in their lives and communities.

Below is an explanation of the Buckets of Sunshine projection at Annual Convention.

The organization that the Minnesota WT chapter selected for the Buckets of Sunshine for 2025 is Safe Haven Shelter of Duluth for USWT Annual Convention. The Shelter and Resource Center serves a seven-county area in Northern Minnesota and provide services/education for over 1,500 adults and children annually.

There was a question about the Buckets of Sunshine project and why we are helping an organization in Minnesota when our own state has needs. The idea of the USWT Buckets of Sunshine Project (BOS) is to have a service campaign that the public can align to the United States Women of Today. It will allow every chapter to work towards a common goal, but will also have the flexibility to adapt to each community's individual needs. Each chapter is encouraged to participate by providing Buckets of Sunshine in their community as well as in the USWT Buckets of Sunshine for the Annual Meeting.

The BOS for the Annual Meeting will be coordinated by the <u>USWT Public Relations Director</u>, with the approval of the Marketing Committee, <u>USWT President</u>, and <u>USWT Membership Vice President</u>. A specific program must be promoted early and especially at mid-year convention with a complete information packet to be provided for the members to make this project a huge national success and obtain national recognition that is so well deserved. This project makes a difference in the community that our annual convention is held and to the local communities that receive these bucket(s) as well.

USWT Buckets of Sunshine Project History

At the 1996 Annual meeting the Future Directions Committee decided to create a project that would bring name recognition to the organization through public relations. After much brainstorming and idea sharing, the Buckets of Sunshine Project was selected. The goal is to provide "buckets" filled with products to local crisis centers (particularly focused toward women and children). The donated items would benefit someone leaving the center and help defray expenses by starting over in a new home or apartment.

At the June 2002 Annual Meeting, the Marketing Committee decided not to associate the Buckets of Sunshine project with "Make a Difference Day." It was felt that if the two are kept separate, our communities would benefit from them both. It seems to be confusing to our members along with people in the community and it was felt that the Buckets of Sunshine was lost in the media hype of Make a Difference Day.

It is one of my job responsibilities to promote and educate the membership about the organization that as selected for BOS. If you have any questions or need information, please reach out!

I want to remind everyone that when you are out and about, share Women of Today with women you meet. Do you have a chapter brochure that you can carry in your purse or backpack ready to share? How about chapter business cards to hand out or post on community bulletin boards? If you need help designing either of the above marketing tools, just contact me and we can work on it together.

Effects of domestic violence on children

Many children exposed to violence in the home are also victims of physical abuse. Children who witness domestic violence or are victims of abuse themselves are at serious risk for long-term physical and mental health problems.² Children who witness violence between parents may also be at greater risk of being violent in their future relationships. If you are a parent who is experiencing abuse, it can be difficult to know how to protect your child.

More than 15 million children in the United States live in homes in which domestic violence has happened at least once. These children are at greater risk for repeating the cycle as adults by entering into abusive relationships or becoming abusers themselves. For example, a boy who sees his mother being abused is 10 times more likely to abuse his female partner as an adult. A girl who grows up in a home where her father abuses her mother is more than six times as likely to be sexually abused as a girl who grows up in a non-abusive home.

Children who witness or are victims of emotional, physical, or sexual abuse are at higher risk for health problems as adults. These can include <u>mental health</u> conditions, such as <u>depression</u> and <u>anxiety</u>. They may also include <u>diabetes</u>, obesity, <u>heart disease</u>, poor self-esteem, and other problems.

Each child responds differently to abuse and trauma. Some children are more resilient, and some are more sensitive. How successful a child is at recovering from abuse or trauma depends on several things, including having:

- A good support system or good relationships with trusted adults
- High self-esteem
- Healthy friendships

Although children will probably never forget what they saw or experienced during the abuse, they can learn healthy ways to deal with their emotions and memories as they mature. The sooner a child gets help, the better his or her chances for becoming a mentally and physically healthy adult.

You can help your children by:

- **Helping them feel safe.** Children who witness or experience domestic violence need to feel safe. Consider whether <u>leaving the abusive relationship</u> might help your child feel safer. Talk to your child about the importance of healthy relationships.
- Talking to them about their fears. Let them know that it's not their fault or your fault.
- Talking to them about healthy relationships. Help them learn from the abusive experience by talking about what healthy relationships are and are not. This will help them know what is healthy when they start romantic relationships of their own.
- Talking to them about boundaries. Let your child know that no one has the right to touch them or make them feel uncomfortable, including family members, teachers, coaches, or other

- authority figures. Also, explain to your child that he or she doesn't have the right to touch another person's body, and if someone tells them to stop, they should do so right away.
- Helping them find a reliable support system. In addition to a parent, this can be a school
 counselor, a therapist, or another trusted adult who can provide ongoing support. Know that
 school counselors are required to report domestic violence or abuse if they suspect it.
- Getting them professional help. Cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) is a type of talk therapy
 or counseling that may work best for children who have experienced violence or abuse. CBT is
 especially helpful for children who have anxiety or other mental health problems as a result of
 the trauma. During CBT, a therapist will work with your child to turn negative thoughts into
 more positive ones. The therapist can also help your child learn healthy ways to cope with
 stress.


We will be having our final State Meeting on April 27th in Tempe and hope to have a great time and elections at that meeting.
