
Cain and Abel

God liked Abel's sacrifice, but He did not like Cain's. Cain maybe didn't give God the best. Maybe he didn't give God enough. Maybe he had a grumpy attitude about having to give anything to God. The bible doesn't tell us why God didn't like Cain's offering, but it did tell us that when it happened, Cain felt a little sad, but he was also very angry. God told Cain not to get so mad about what had happened, but he should just try to do it again the right way. Cain didn't listen. He got very mad and not just at God but at Abel too. He was so mad, he went out into the field where Abel was, and he attacked him and killed him. He killed his own brother instead of trying to fix his mistake.

Later, God asked Cain where Abel was. Cain knew exactly where Abel was but instead of telling God, he said "I know not, Am I my brother's keeper?" He lied to God and even talked to God in a sassy attitude. God knew exactly what had happened and He was very disappointed with Cain. He told Cain he would no longer be able to be a farmer and that he had to leave his family. Cain moved by himself to a place called Nod. There Cain lived the rest of his life raising his own family away from Adam and Eve. Cain stopped praising God and he didn't teach his family to love God the way they should. 








When we are giving an offering to God, we are supposed to give our very best. Look at the groups of items below, circle the item in each group that would be the best choice for an offering to God.
