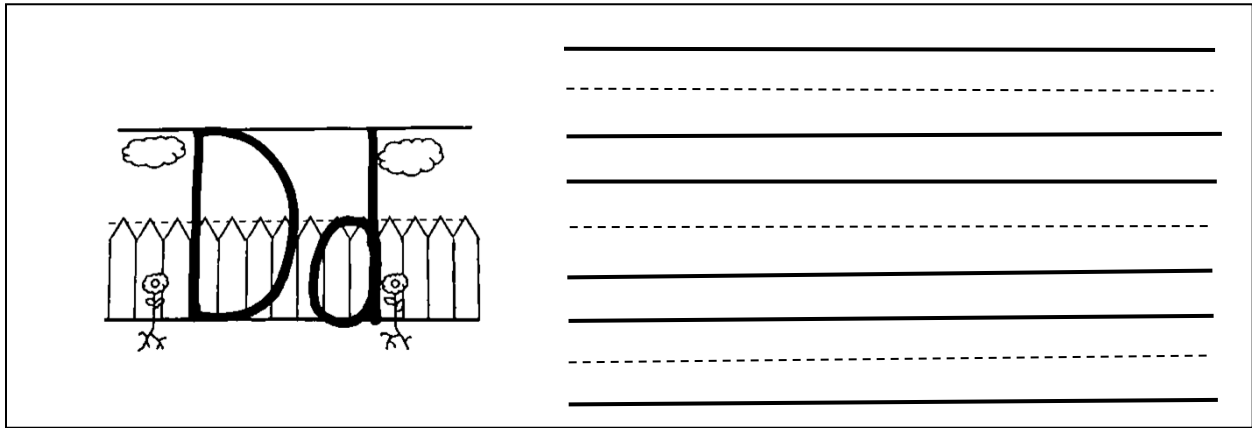
Daniel and the Lion's Den

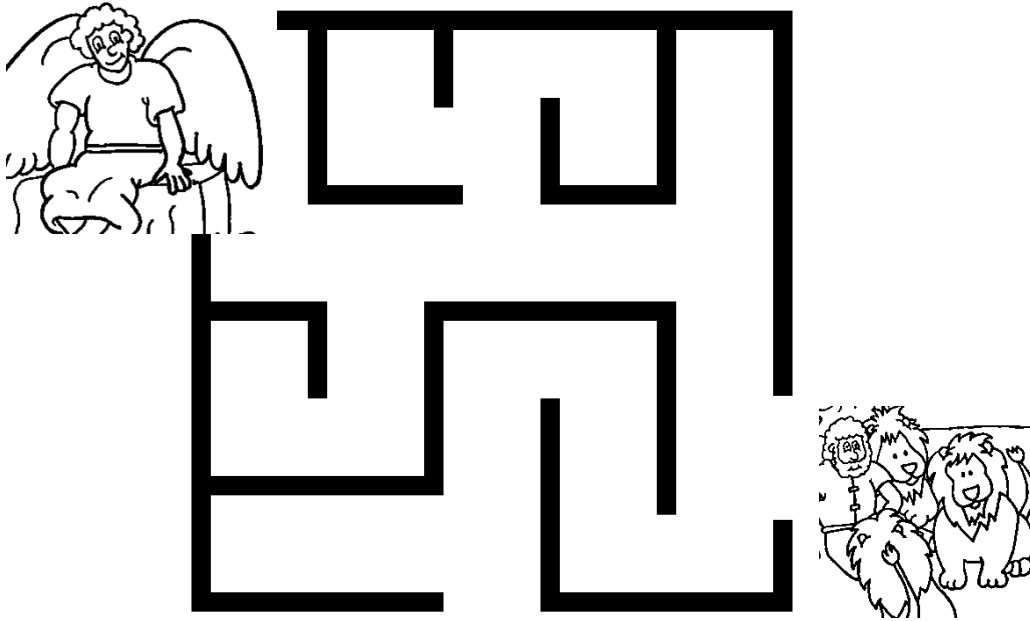

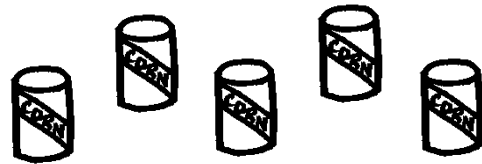
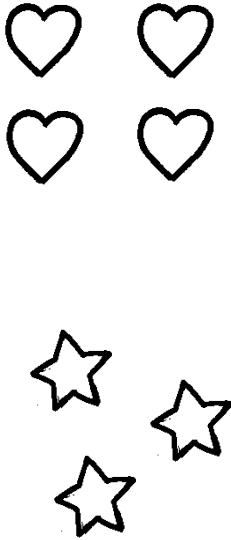
