"Why are you hiding?" asked God.

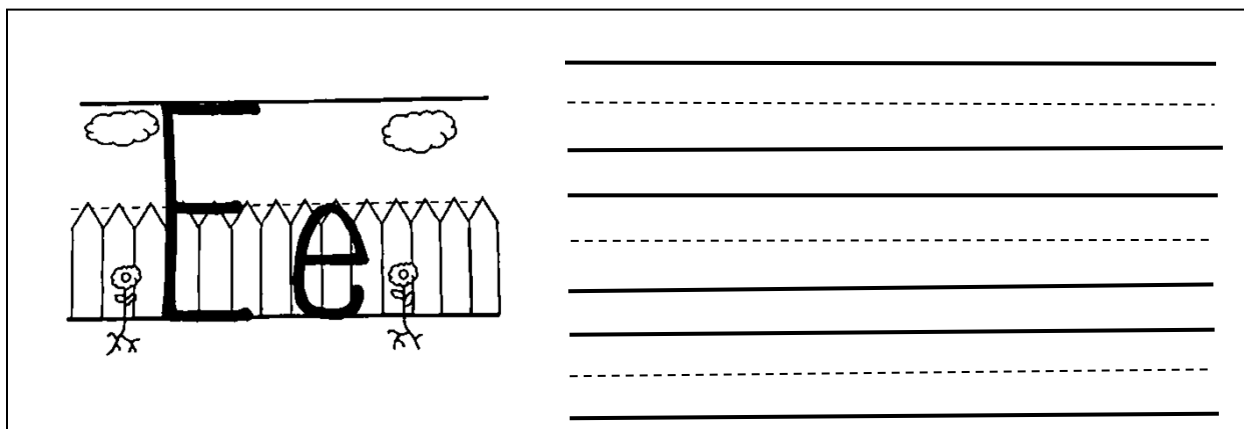
"Because we are naked," Adam replied.

"Who told you that you were naked? Did you eat of The Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil?" asked God.

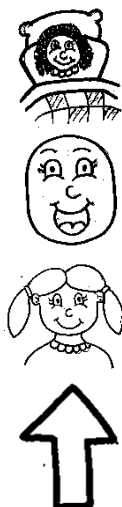
"The woman gave me the fruit and I ate it." Adam blamed Eve.

"The serpent tricked me, and I ate it," said Eve, blaming the serpent.

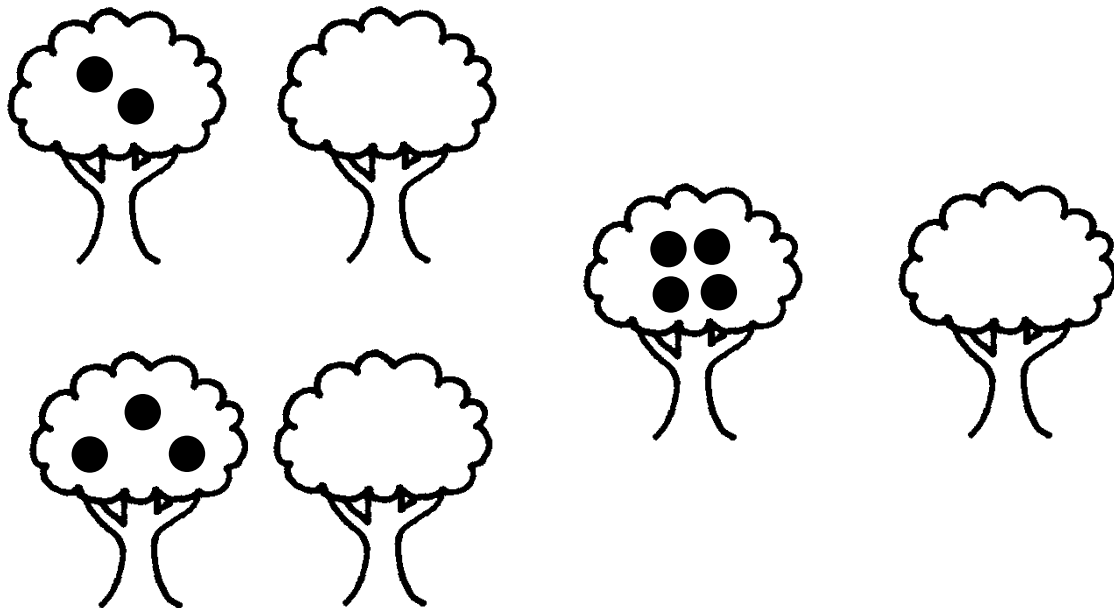
