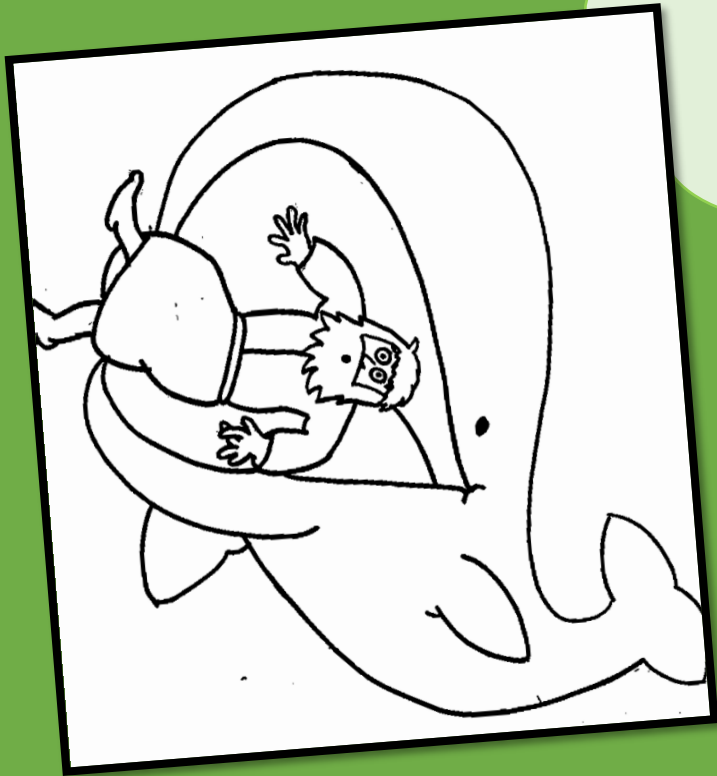

Jonah and the Whale

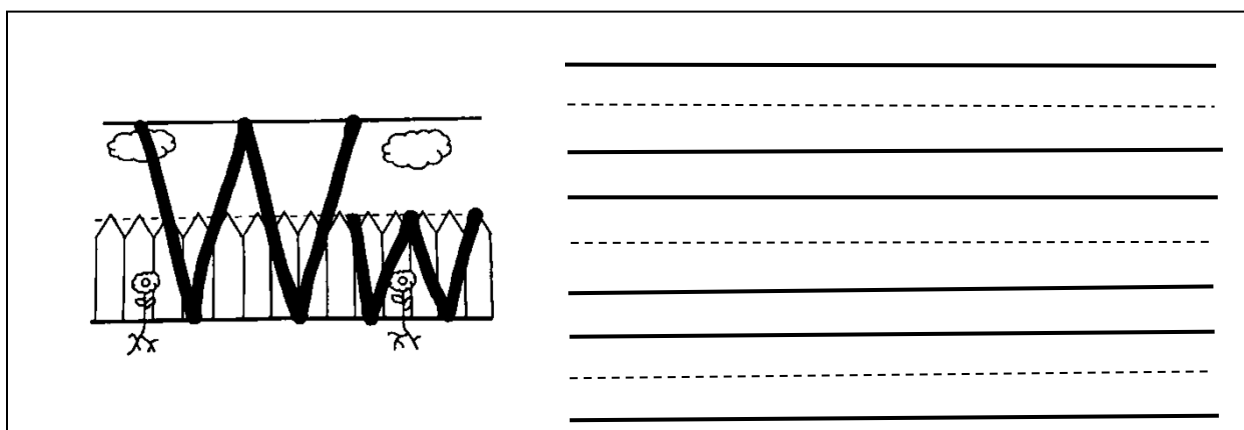

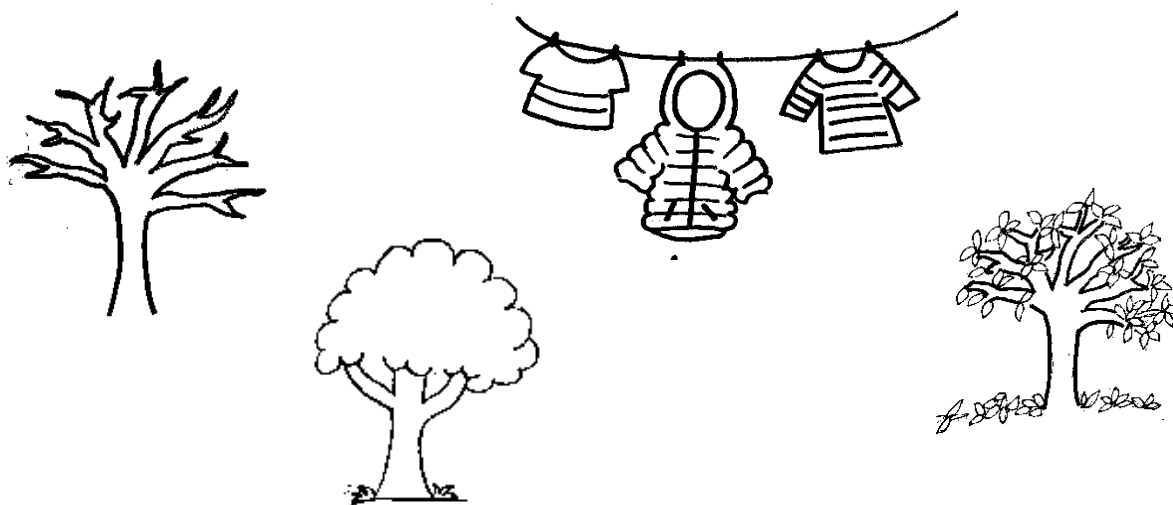

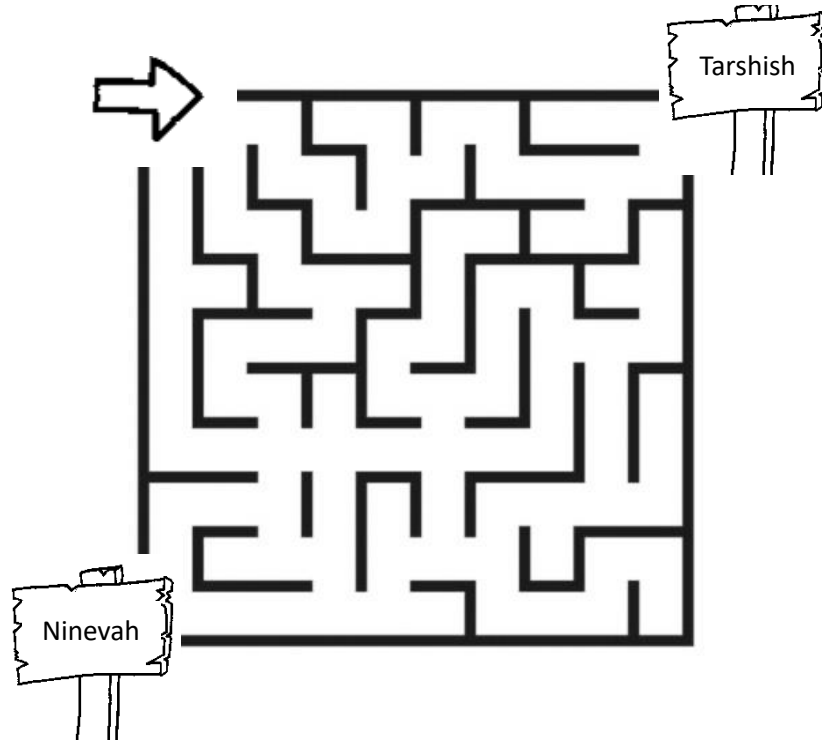
