Joseph's Colorful Coat

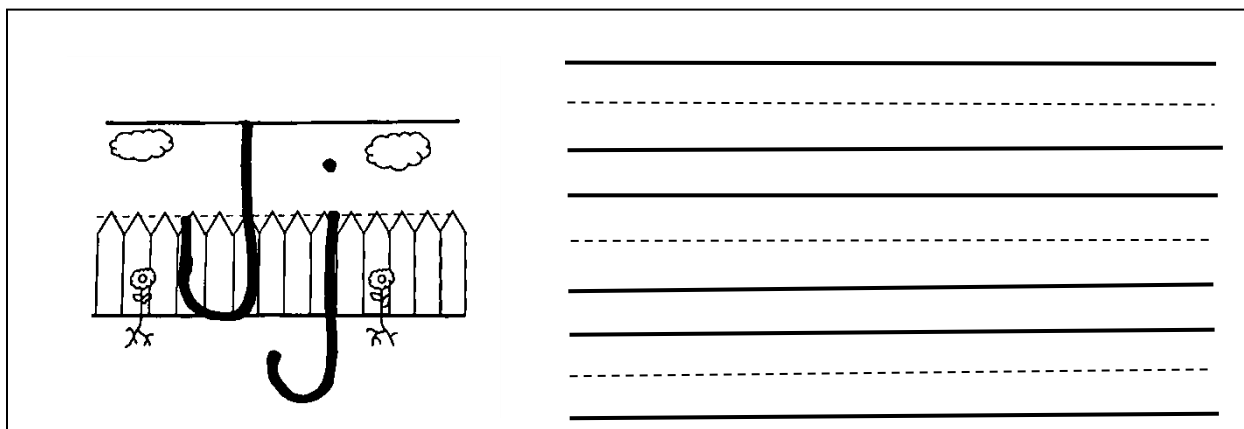

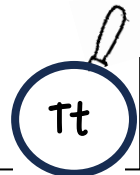
