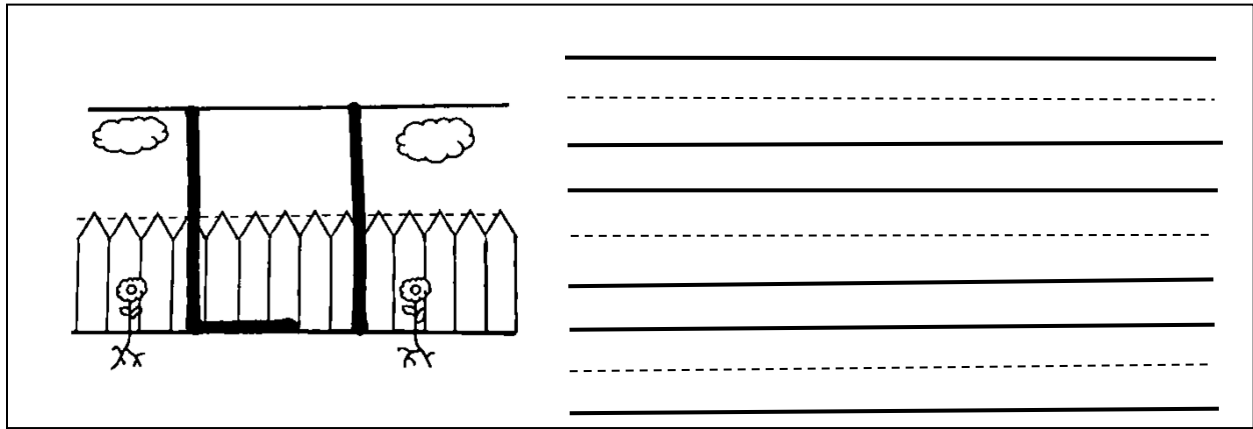
It took Jesus two days to get to Bethany but when he arrived, Martha ran to meet him. She was so happy to see Jesus, but she was still very sad about her brother.


