The Quiet Queen

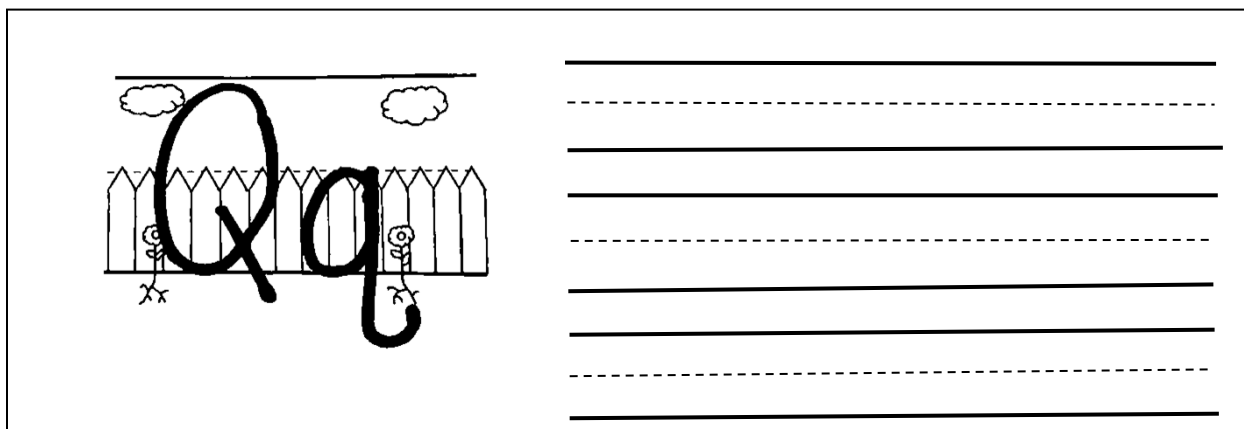

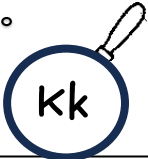
