## Timothy Teaches

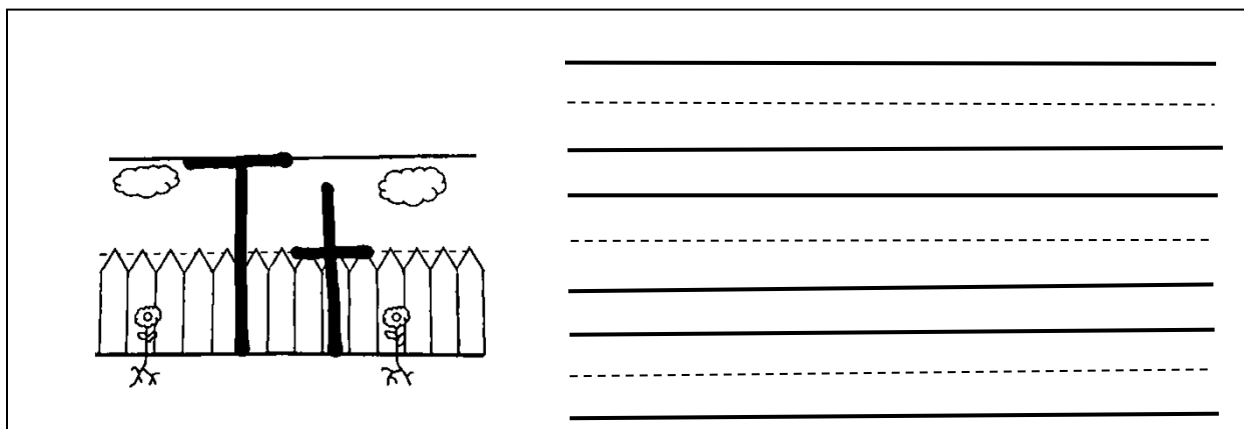

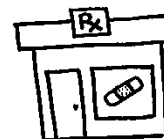
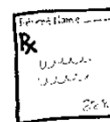

Sometimes Paul would send Timothy to deliver those letters or to check with the people to see that they received their letters.

After a while, Timothy was ready to start doing some of the things Paul was doing all by himself and there were times he had to do things by himself because Paul had been thrown in prison. Paul didn't want Timothy to wait for him to get out of prison so they could go places together. He wanted Timothy to keep going and keep telling people even though Paul himself wasn't able to go with him. When Paul was stuck in prison, he would write letters, he would pray, and he would tell other prisoners and the guards about Jesus. From prison Paul wrote 2 very important letters to Timothy. Those letters became part of the bible. They are called 1 Timothy and 2 Timothy. In those letters Paul encouraged Timothy to do what God was calling him to do. Paul knew that some people would listen to Timothy and some people would not listen. Some people wouldn't like what Timothy had to say and be angry and some people would think Timothy was too young to know what he was talking about. Paul didn't want Timothy to get discouraged and want to quit. Paul's letters were to help Timothy stay strong and remember all the things that God had promised them.

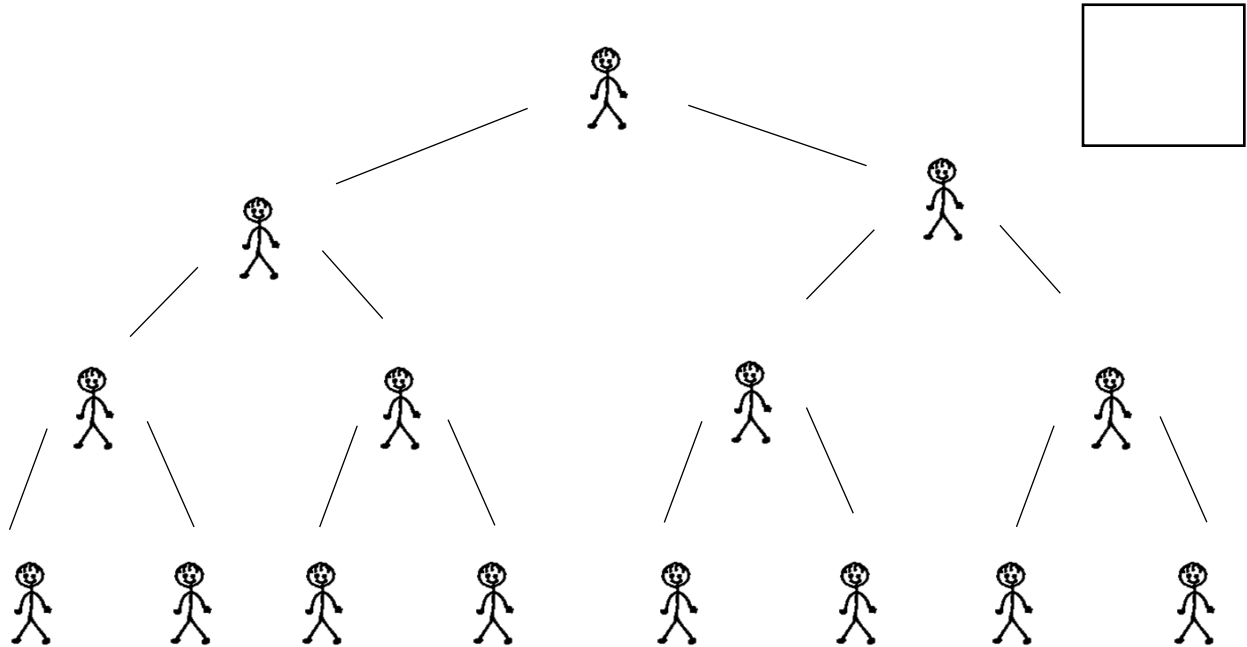
