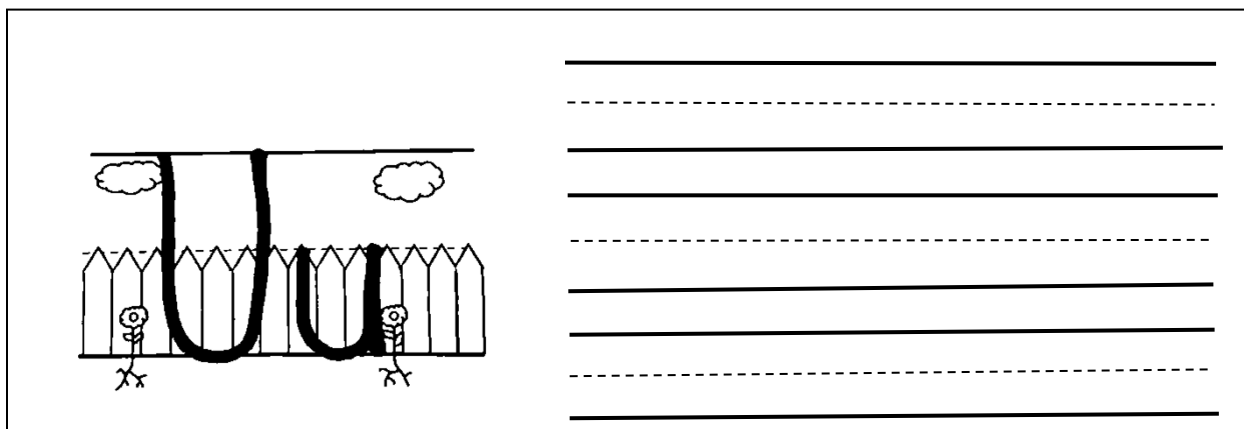
Unloved Leah

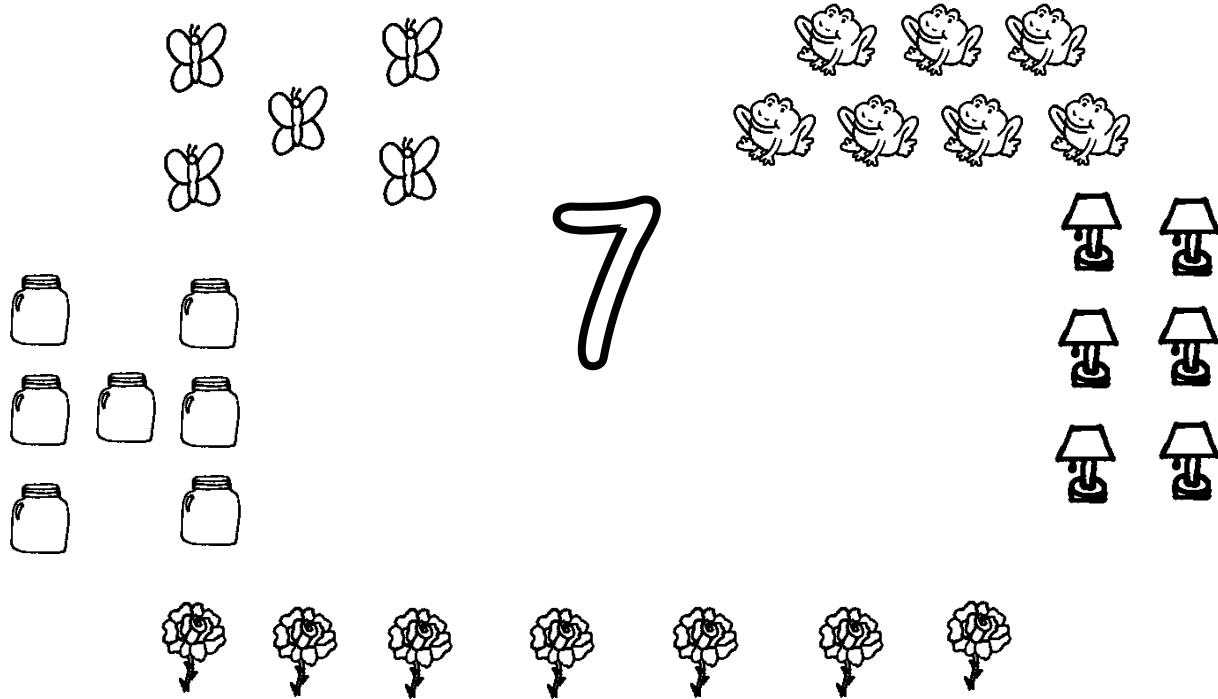
