2020 was a unique year with sufficient food to distribute to our clients. We have helped 9,031 families with services totaling \$1,720,502 for the year 2020. This is with the problems encountered with Covid 19 beginning in March until the end of the year. TXU has been very generous with allowing us to help our clients with their TXU electric bills totaling \$73,148 in 2020.

A special thanks to all our volunteers who pick up food donations and deliver to NEED West. Neighborhood WalmarT and Kroger in Richland Hills, two Kroger stores in Keller and COSCO have blessed us with our food donations. We also appreciate Rufe Snow Farmers Market in North Richland Hills for their generous contributions.

Due to Covid, we were unable to distribute our Easter baskets and our Christmas program for our clients in 2020. We are hoping to resume our Easter and Christmas program in the future.

I wish I could list all the wonderful donations we receive. All the donations we receive are very much appreciated.

We continue to receive donations from Walmart, Target, Sprout's, Papa John's Pizza, and the Olive Garden. They have been blessing us with donations for many years.

TXU continues to give funds to help clients. They were particularly generous this year to help after the winter storm hit. They provided an extra \$50,000 to be split between NEED East and NEED West.

They work very hard at filling orders, stocking shelves, picking up donations, entering information into the computer, and helping to keep the operation going. The year of 2020 was unlike any other. Initially our business was doing alright. The rollout sign was utilized during the month of March which helped increase sales.

By March 23rd we had to close our doors to the public. Thankfully, as a part of the N.E.E.D. organization we were able to continue working on an abbreviated schedule during the shutdown caused by Covid-19. However, we were no longer able to do clothing vouchers for clients.

We cleaned up and cleaned out as much as possible. We set up and rearranged displays. The store was spruced up. We helped N.E.E.D. with donations. One of our employees picked up food at Sprout's for N.E.E.D. East. Two employees worked at N.E.E.D. West two days a week. We stayed busy and everyone worked hard.

In June we began accepting donations on a limited basis. We quarantined the items for three days before processing.

Eventually we prepared for re-opening by marking off the floor and sidewalk and setting up displays to allow for social distancing. Signage was made to designate certain areas and provide instruction. A plexiglass barrier was installed at the counter. A hand sanitizing station was set up. Many other Covid-19 protocols were put in place.

We re-opened on August 1, 2020, again on a shortened schedule. Our faithful and generous donors and customers were happy that we were still in business. The employees of Twice Blessed are grateful for all the support and help we have received.

To say the least, sales were not good in 2020 but God brought us through this and taught us a lot.
