

PETITION TO THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

WHEREAS

- Canadians expect that employment opportunities in Canada should prioritize qualified citizens and permanent residents;
- Many Canadians continue to face barriers to employment, including underemployment and regional labour market mismatches;
- Concerns have been raised about the growing number of positions supported by Labour Market Impact Assessments (LMIAs), including cases where Canadians may be available and qualified to perform the work;
- The Temporary Foreign Worker Program (TFWP), including LMIAs, is intended to address genuine labour shortages where qualified Canadians are not available;

THEREFORE

We, the undersigned citizens and permanent residents of Canada, call upon the Government of Canada to ensure that Canadians and permanent residents are given priority for available jobs before employers are permitted to hire through the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and strengthen oversight and enforcement of the use of LMIAs to prevent potential misuse of the program and ensure it operates as intended.
