BRIEF FOR HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR
OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Troops on Parade

1. Western Australian University Regiment grouped in four companies will form up on the inspection line in three ranks.
2. The band for the Ceremony will be the Western Command Band.
3. A drum Corps will be formed from the Western Australian University Regiment Band and be attached to the Western Command Band for the Ceremony.

Parade Ground

1. WHITFIELD COURT. (See Site Plan attached).

Reception of His Excellency

5. The General Officer Commanding Western Command and Mrs HARRISON will await His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER at the entrance to WHITFIELD COURT at 1450 hrs.
6. His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER are escorted to the dais area.
7. The General Officer Commanding presents to His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER, the Chancellor of the University of Western Australia and Mrs REID, the Minister of State for the Army and Mrs CRAMER, the Commander 13 Infantry Brigade and Mrs NEWBERY, the Honorary Colonel and the wife of the Commanding Officer, Mrs COWARD. See Annex B.
8. His Excellency, with in immediate attendance, the General Officer Commanding, the Commander 13 Infantry Brigade and the Honorary Colonel ascend the dais. See Annex B.
9. The Commanding Officer orders a Royal Salute.
10. The Honourable Lady GAIRDNER, the Honorable J.O. CRAMER, MP and Mrs CRAMER, Mrs NEWBERY, Mrs COWARD, the Chancellor of the University of Western Australia and Mrs REID will be escorted to seats on the terrace.
11. The Commanding Officer will move to the base of the terrace and report to His Excellency.
12. His Excellency, with in immediate attendance, the General Officer Commanding, the Commander 13 Infantry Brigade, the Honorary Colonel and the Aide de Camp descend the steps from the terrace and inspect the Regiment and the Western Command Band. See Annex B.

13. Immediately following the inspection of the band the Commanding Officer will salute His Excellency and move to his position for the consecration ceremony. See Annex C.
14. His Excellency and the Officers in immediate attendance move to their positions for the consecration ceremony. See Annex C.
15. When all are in position the Commanding Officer will commence the service. See Annex D.
16. The Commanding Officer orders the Regiment to attention and asks the Chaplains to bid God's blessing on the Colours.
17. The Chaplains, in turn, consecrate, bless and dedicate the Colours.
18. The Commanding Officer stands the parade at ease and continues the service; (see Annex D) concluding with the Lords Prayer.
19. The Commanding Officer will order the parade to attention, and the subalterns will move forward and kneel.
20. The two majors will take up the Colours and carry them to a position on the outside front of the two subalterns and face inwards.
21. As His Excellency approaches the Major will hand the Colour to him. When the Queens Colour and then the Regimental Colour has been handed over by His Excellency the subalterns rise and remain at attention, Colours at the carry. The two Majors step back one pace and salute.
22. His Excellency salutes the Colours.
23. The Commanding Officer orders the parade to stand easy.
24. His Excellency now addresses the parade. See Appendix 1 to Annex G.
25. The Commanding Officer replies to His Excellency's address.
26. On conclusion the Commanding Officer will step back one pace and salute His Excellency.
27. The Chaplains move to their original positions at the foot of the terrace. See Annex C.
28. His Excellency is escorted to the foot of the steps, and The General Officer Commanding presents the Chaplains to His Excellency.
29. The drums microphones and kneelers are now removed.
30. His Excellency and officers in immediate attendance now ascend the dais. (Positions are shown in Annex B). At the same time the Chaplains leave the parade ground and resume their seats on the terrace.
31. When His Excellency ascends the dais the Subalterns turn about and face the Regiment.
32. The Commanding Officer orders a General Salute.

33. On the third movement of the Present the Band plays the General Salute. On completion of the General Salute the Band will play two three beat rolls followed immediately by the National Anthem. The subalterns will step off in slow time with the Colours flying, on the first beat of the National Anthem.

34. When the Colour Party arrives in position in the centre of the Regiment it halts and turns about.

35. The Commanding Officer orders the parade to stand at ease.

Parading the Colours

36. The Band marches and counter marches in front of the Regiment in slow time and quick time.

37. The Colours are then paraded in front of the Regiment in slow time. The Colour Party Commander orders Colour Party slow march. The Regiment presents arms.

38. After parading, the Colours resume their position in the centre of the parade.

March Past and Advance in Review Order

39. The Regiment march past His Excellency in quick time.

40. The Regiment reform on the inspection line.

41. The Regiment advances in review order and the Commanding Officer orders a Royal Salute. The Western Command Band plays the first six bars of the National Anthem.

Departure of His Excellency from the Parade.

42. His Excellency then descends the dais and is joined by The Honourable Lady GAIRDNER.

43. His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER are escorted to the exit of WHITFIELD COURT by The General Officer Commanding Western Command and Mrs HARRISON.

44. As His Excellency arrives at the exit the Commanding Officer orders in farewell a Royal Salute.

45. His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER then move to the Sunken Garden for afternoon tea, by the following roads:-

EAST along Stirling Highway to Hackett Drive,
Princess Road, thence by Fairway to the WEST
entrance of the University.

Reception at the Garden

46. His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER are received by the Commanding Officer and Mrs COWARD at the entrance to the Garden.

47. Principal Guests will be presented by the Commanding Officer.

52. His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER depart.

10. 1451 hours The General Officer Commanding presents to His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER the Minister of State for the Army and Mrs J.O. CRAMER and the persons shown in Annex B sub-para (a).
11. 1452 hours His Excellency, with in immediate attendance, the General Officer Commanding, Commander 13 Infantry Brigade and the Honorary Colonel ascend the dais. See Annex B. The Regiment gives a Royal Salute. On the conclusion of the Royal Salute, the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER, the Minister of State for the Army and Mrs CRAMER, the Chancellor of the University of Western Australia and Mrs REID, Mrs HARRISON, Mrs NEWBERY and Mrs COWARD are shown to their seats on the terrace.

Inspections

12. The Commanding Officer reports to His Excellency.
13. His Excellency, with in immediate attendance, the officers shown in Annex B descend the steps from the terrace to inspect the parade.
14. During the inspection of the Western Command Band, the Bandmaster only should accompany His Excellency.

28. His Excellency now departs for the Sunken Garden along the following roads :-
EAST to Hackett Drive thence to Princess Road thence to Fairway to the WEST entrance to the University.
29. The Honorary Colonel and Mrs COWARD move to the Sunken Garden to receive guests for afternoon tea.
30. The Minister of State for the Army and Mrs CRAMER are escorted to the entrance and depart.
31. The General Officer Commanding and Mrs HARRISON depart followed by the Commander 13 Infantry Brigade and Mrs NEWBERY.

32. Senior principal guests follow to arrive at the Sunken Garden before His Excellency.

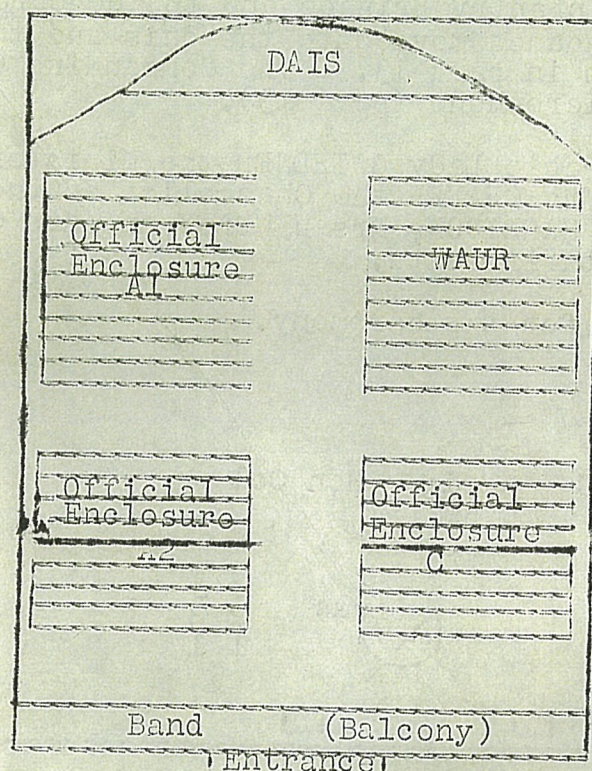
WET WEATHER PROGRAMME

General

1. In the event of wet weather the Presentation and Consecration Ceremony will be held in WINTHROP HALL. This will necessitate changing the form of parade to just the Consecration, Blessing and Dedication Service followed by the presentation and receiving into the Regiment of the Colours.

Seating Plan

2. The seating arrangement in WINTHROP HALL will be as follows:-



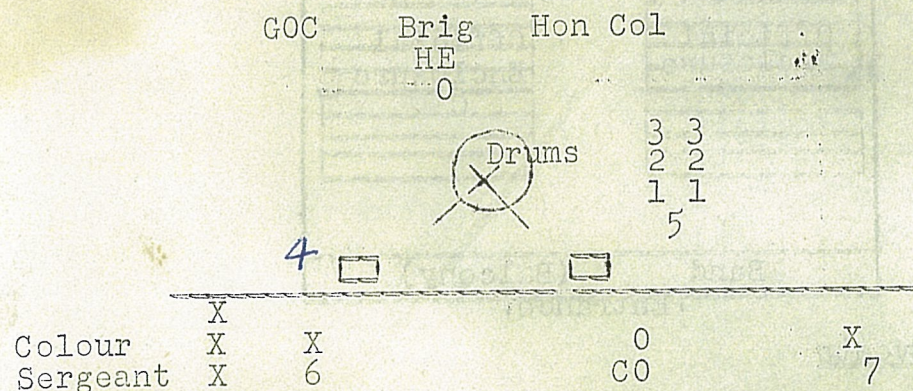
Sequence of Events

3. Guests will be seated by 1430 hrs. Music is to be provided by Western Command Band during the arrival of guests.
4. The Regiment moves into WINTHROP HALL at 1435 hrs and files into their seats.
5. The drum corp march down the aisle onto the dais and pile drums at 1440 hrs. Following immediately after the departure of the drum corp the speakers and kneelers will be placed in position.
6. At 1445 hrs the Colour Party the Colour orderlies and the two majors will move down the aisle the lieutenants colour bearers and the colour sergeants moving directly to their position (para 13) and the majors and colour orderlies move onto the dais and uncase the colours. The colour orderlies move back down the aisle with the colour cases, the majors drape the colours on the drum pile and step back to their position (para 13) facing inwards.

16. The presentation, address by His Excellency and the reply by the Commanding Officer will follow.
17. The Regiment will then be called to attention when they will rise and stand to attention; the guests will rise.
18. The Lieutenant colour bearers will turn about and the General Salute will be played, followed immediately by the NATIONAL ANTHEM.
19. The Lieutenants then slow march down the steps to a position forward of the front row.
20. At the conclusion of the NATIONAL ANTHEM the Colour Sergeants will join the Lieutenants and the Colour Party will slow march down the aisle and out of the Hall.
21. His Excellency is escorted to the front of the dais and the NATIONAL ANTHEM is played in farewell.
22. His Excellency then descends the dais and is joined by The Honourable Lady GAIRDNER.
23. His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER are escorted to the exit of WINTHROP HALL from whence they will be taken to the Students Refectory.
24. The Commanding Officer and Mrs COWARD will receive guests and His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER at the Refectory.

Paragraphs 7 to 15 appear on reverse side of other sheet.

7. At 1448 hrs the Chaplains will move down the aisle and take up their position on the dais (para 13).
8. During this time the Commanding Officer and Mrs COWARD will receive the members of the official party in the order of arrival as shown in the separate briefs.
9. On the arrival of His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER, the General Officer Commanding Western Command will present the Chancellor of the University and Mrs REID, the Minister of State for the Army and Mrs CRAMER, the Commander 13 Infantry Brigade and Mrs NEWBERY the Honourary Colonel WAUR, the Commanding Officer WAUR and Mrs COWARD.
10. As soon as His Excellency enters the Hall proper the Regiment will be called to attention then they will rise and stand to attention; the guests will rise.
11. His Excellency with the General Officer Commanding, The Commander 13 Infantry Brigade and the Honourary Colonel in immediate attendance move onto the dais and take up their positions as shown in para 13. The Commanding Officer moves directly to his microphone (para 13).
12. The Honourable Lady GAIRDNER the Minister of State for the Army and Mrs CRAMER the Chancellor of the University and Mrs REID, Mrs HARRISON, Mrs NEWBERY and Mrs COWARD will then be shown to their seats.

12. The General Officer Commanding and Mrs HARRISON move to the entrance of WHITFIELD COURT to await the arrival of His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER.
13. His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER move to the dais area. Those present are presented. See Annex B.
14. His Excellency, and officers in immediate attendance, ascend the dais.
15. His Excellency receives a Royal Salute.
16. At the conclusion of the Royal Salute :-
 - (a) The Inspection party descend to the parade ground.
 - (b) The Honourable Lady GAIRDNER, Mrs HARRISON, Mrs NEWBERY, Mrs COWARD and the Chancellor of the University of Western Australia and Mrs REID are shown to their seats on the terrace to the RIGHT of the dais.

Inspection

17. For positions see Annex B.
18. The Bandmaster Western Command Band only should accompany His Excellency during the inspection of the Band.
19. The Commanding Officer will salute His Excellency and return to his position on the parade on the completion of the inspection of the Regiment.

Consecration Ceremony

20. On completion of the inspection the inspecting party move to their position for the consecration ceremony. See Annex C.
21. On conclusion of the ceremony the Chaplains are presented to His Excellency.
22. The inspecting party ascends the dais.

March Past and Advance in Review Order

23. Before the march past the Colours are paraded.
24. The Regiment march past in quick time.
25. The Regiment advances in review order.

Departure of His Excellency

26. His Excellency now descends the dais.
27. The Honourable Lady GAIRDNER, Mrs HARRISON, Mrs NEWBERY and Mrs COWARD join the official party for the departure of His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER.
28. His Excellency and the Honourable Lady GAIRDNER are escorted to the second terrace by the General Officer Commanding. At this stage a Royal Salute is ordered by the Commanding Officer.
