



“War and conflict sadly seem to be a feature in our lives today - for some as a headline they see or hear perhaps daily or weekly and for others a lived reality and the reason their world has suddenly turned upside down. As a globally connected community, it is impossible to ignore the consequences of war. As we receive children from war affected countries within our local communities suddenly the reality of conflict is brought closer to home for many.”

As a hosting nation for children and families fleeing conflict, I believe it is our duty to find ways of supporting children as they adjust to life in another country. As they grapple with cultural, language, environmental, educational and many other changes it remains crucial to address the consequences of conflict on their wellbeing, including the impact of trauma, displacement and loss.

This conference draws upon the expertise of those actively involved in supporting children and families affected by war, demonstrating practical ways to develop psychologically and culturally relevant trauma screening and support programmes that address childrens' needs and which can be implemented in local schools and through collaborative partnerships.

The work undertaken with Ukrainian children gives me great hope for future projects with children arriving from other conflict zones and exemplifies the benefits of experts working with community organisations that hold cultural expertise. I somewhat ambitiously hope the learning will be adopted as a national programme for all refugees, as there is much disparity in the support currently available to children based on where they live. The work with St Mary's Ukrainian School gives me much hope for the future of children affected by war and serves as a model intervention in this area.”

- **Holiday Provision:** Ensuring continuous support and engagement during school holidays.

Afterschool Activities/Enrichment weekends and evenings. Offering art, music, drama, IT, and photography classes to enhance students' creative and technical skills.

Project Warm Space: A dedicated initiative to support families and elderly displaced cohorts on their integration journey: legal consultations, ESOL classes, enrichment such as art and embroidery, and book club.

Since the first days of the full-scale invasion, **Inna has been leading St. Mary's** in a fast-paced and demanding environment, aimed at doing the very best for its pupils and families, while being their voice to local authorities and the government. **Trauma support and the creation of a healing environment** quickly became the focus of **St. Mary's**. Thanks to the resilience, dedication, and professionalism of the team, new collaborations were launched, and new approaches aimed at trauma healing were piloted. Very soon, positive changes were noticed. Routine, structure, leisure, trust, and a multi-agency approach have proven to make a positive impact. In 2023, Inna was honored with **an MBE for her services to education and the Ukrainian community in the UK**. Under her leadership, **the St. Mary's Ukrainian School Trauma Recovery Team was nominated for the Lionel Hersov Memorial Award at the 2024 ACAMH Awards**, recognizing their commitment to supporting children affected by the war in Ukraine.

Tetiana Humberstone

Senior ESW Lead | Trauma Support Project Lead | GCSE Delivery Lead at Ukrainian St Mary's Trust | St. Paul's Boys School and St. Mary's Ukrainian Schools Partnership Manager

Over the last two years, my work with displaced children has revealed the profound impact trauma can have on their lives. Witnessing the struggles these children face, I felt a deep responsibility to provide more than just basic support—I wanted to help them heal, recover, and rebuild their sense of safety and hope. This led me to take on a leadership role in Trauma Recovery Support for displaced children, where I can work directly with these vulnerable individuals and ensure they receive the care and attention they desperately need.

My job is to make a real difference in the lives of these children. Helping them regain their confidence and seeing them thrive despite the hardships they've endured is incredibly rewarding. I also deeply value the relationships I build, not only with the children but with the dedicated teams and communities working together to foster resilience and recovery. It's a privilege to contribute to their healing journey, and it drives my passion for this work every day.

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Dr Jai Shree Adhyaru

*Consultant Counselling Psychologist
at CAST, Centre for Anxiety, Stress and Trauma*

Dr. Jai is a Counselling Psychologist with expertise in working with children in forensic, community, and youth settings. She was involved in the UK's first trial of Multisystemic Therapy (MST), a model focused on addressing high-risk behaviors such as suicidal ideation and violence through home-based interventions. Dr. Jai's work in developing MST teams in Birmingham and London, combined with her experience in designing services for underserved populations, led to the creation of crisis response services, including the Grenfell Health & Wellbeing Service and mental health screening for refugees from Afghanistan and Ukraine.

In addition to her role as a Consultant Psychologist in the NHS, Dr. Jai runs a private practice, consults on crisis-related emotional impact, and supervises professionals. Her research focuses on staff wellbeing, burnout prevention, and digital interventions in health. As a 2021 Digital Pioneer Fellow, she advises on using apps, virtual reality, and augmented reality in therapy. Dr. Jai serves as Lead Psychologist for Hidden Strength, an app-based therapy platform for young people, and guest lectures at several universities, with honorary roles at Cardiff University and Kingston University.

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Dr John Green

John Green is a Clinical Psychologist. After qualifying he specialised in psychological and behavioural aspects of infectious diseases, co-editing the first textbook in the world on the clinical management of AIDS and heading a national training unit for AIDS/HIV counselling. He carried out consultancies overseas on AIDS and other infectious diseases on behalf of international agencies and developed an interest in the broader management of major health emergencies and disasters.

For many years he was Chief Psychologist for an NHS Trust as well as Clinical Director for 5 IAPT (NHS Talking Therapies for Anxiety and Depression) services as well as being an active researcher. He co-ordinated the NHS mental health response to the Ladbroke Grove Rail Crash and was Clinical Director for mental health for the Grenfell Tower Fire response. He has recently been particularly interested in how cross-agency partnerships can provide effective help to people with PTSD and other trauma spectrum disorders after disasters at a time when human and financial resource are stretched in the UK and overseas. Much of his recent work has been with forced migrants.

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Kateryna Yavna

Kateryna is the Lead Psychologist at Ukrainian St Mary's Trust, where she oversees psychological support and trauma care for individuals affected by war and displacement. She is also a trainer in the UK-based "Healing Techniques" program, focused on helping children recover from the effects of trauma. From 2022 to 2023, she served as a supervisor for the "Poruch" project, supported by UNICEF, and consulted for the NHS, providing psychosocial support to Ukrainian refugees.

In addition, she has contributed to the "Rucksack" project, developing therapeutic exercises for families in the UK, and has facilitated CBT-based webinars on disordered eating and trauma, helping professionals enhance their skills in trauma care. In 2023, she led psychosocial support efforts in the "Soborna Ukraine" project, further solidifying her expertise in trauma intervention and care. Her extensive work across British and international projects highlights her dedication to healing trauma in both children and adults.

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David Trickey

David is a leading Consultant Clinical Psychologist and Co-Director of the UK Trauma Council. He has specialised in working with traumatised children, young people, and their families since 2000, particularly following domestic abuse and family homicide.

He continues to focus on direct clinical work, as well as the training, supervision, and support of others and is the clinical team lead for a specialist service for Children in Care. He presents at conferences and supervises research.

He is chartered by the British Psychological Society and registered with the Health and Care Professions Council. He was a member of the committee responsible for the 2018 revision of the NICE Guidelines for PTSD. In all of his roles he draws heavily on the research literature to which he has made a modest contribution.

Viktoriia is an experienced practitioner with a deep commitment to supporting children who have experienced trauma, particularly those affected by forced displacement due to war. With extensive expertise in Inclusion and Special Educational Needs (SEN), she has played a critical role in trauma recovery for SEN Ukrainian children displaced by the ongoing war. In her role as a Lead Educational Support Worker, Viktoriia has been instrumental in bridging communication between Ukrainian families and British schools, aiding children in their adaptation to new environments.

Additionally, as a trainer in Teaching Recovery Techniques (TRT), she equips children with practical tools to manage and recover from trauma, ensuring a comprehensive and culturally competent approach to their emotional and psychological well-being. Her work has had a profound impact on helping children rebuild their sense of security and begin the process of healing from their experiences.

Tetiana is a compassionate expert in teaching recovery techniques to children, particularly focusing on supporting displaced Ukrainian children affected by the ongoing war. As a mother of a displaced child, a teacher with over 15 years of experience, and someone who personally experienced and fled the war, she deeply understands the impact of trauma on young minds. Her work is centered on creating a safe, nurturing environment where Ukrainian children can express their emotions and begin the healing process. Her experience as an education support worker for displaced Ukrainian children in British schools, helping them adjust to a new academic environment while coping with war trauma, naturally led her to continue working as a trainer in recovery techniques.

Through teaching these recovery techniques, Tetiana helps children process their trauma, build resilience, and regain a sense of safety and stability amid their challenging circumstances.
