Cohesive schemes in shades of cream, beige and green have given Athina Bluff the soothing sanctuary she craves at the end of a hectic working day

s an interior designer and founder of Topology Interiors, Athina Bluff (@topologyinteriors) is immersed in myriad ideas on a daily basis, which set her a challenge for choosing the scheme for her own home. 'I'm good at focusing on what a client wants, but in my own projects I'm always changing things up,' says Athina. 'One constant in both work and home is my love of muted, earthy, relaxed neutrals. This has been a great base for the calming soft greens I chose here and my love of mixing vintage and contemporary looks.'

Athina's flat, which she bought with her partner, Theo McInnes, a photographer, is the first place she has owned. An upside to not being able to go out during lockdown was that the couple were able to make the

final push to save money for a deposit. A one-bedroom flat in a converted Victorian house, set in a quiet residential area in London, caught their attention.

'The property had been rented out and inside was mouldy and disgusting but I could visualise a beautiful home with high ceilings and gorgeous period features,' Athina recalls. 'Luckily I was able to call on my build team who spent six months on the renovations, fitting in my project around work for my clients.'

As well as resolving a major damp problem in the bedroom, replacing the kitchen and bathroom, and redoing the electrics, Athina decided to knock down the wall between the sitting room and kitchen. 'I instantly knew the open-plan space would be a good way to add value,' she says. 'We were also able to convert the lean-to

with its plastic roof into a proper home office. Now it has an amazing glass roof and leads onto our patio garden.'

Athina had been pinning ideas and inspiration to her 'Dream Home' Pinterest board for years. She found herself gravitating towards neutral colours in a variety of textures and materials — velvet, linen, jute, marble, metal, rustic wood, reeded glass. 'The combination gives pared-back schemes a dynamic look,' she says, 'with natural plants for instant greenery.' Athina was also able to make purchases from a list of must-have products she had been coveting for some time. 'I bought a bed from Loaf with a gorgeous minty blue velvet headboard, beautiful glossy green tiles for the bathroom and a stylish armchair from Soho Home,' she explains. 'Each room is decorated in creamy stone tones — I can't live

with strong colours — so I started with a statement piece, and then built the scheme up from there.'

The new open-plan kitchen-living area needed a cohesive look, which was achieved with the same wall paint colour, ceiling lights and flooring. Athina toyed with painting the kitchen green but decided the shade might be too much with the green sofa and settled on beige instead. When the couple moved into their flat six months later, Athina added finishing touches with smaller furniture and furnishings.

'It's been such a privilege to do this project and know that the flat is all ours,' explains Athina. 'I still really love it and I don't feel the need to paint the walls or swap furniture out like I might have done in my previous home. I feel very settled here.'
