

Make it! HAIRPIN LEG COFFEE TABLE

Cut a piece of wood or MDF to vour chosen size. Sand the edges thoroughly until they are completely smooth, and lightly sand the table top. Wipe clean with a lint-free cloth. With a brush, apply a coat of avarnish to the tabletop - try Ronseal's interior varnish. €8.40 for 250ml, B&Q. Leave to dry

according to the instructions on the tin, on a flat, stable surface. Place tabletop face down, mark the position of the hairpin legs with a pencil through the screw holes. Attach the hairpin legs by lining them up with the marks you made in step three, and then screwing in place using a drill or screwdriver.
