THE PROBLEM The door opened the wrong way, and we took up the floor tiles and discovered the floorboards were soaked and rotten. There was a curved bath in the corner with an awkward gap we couldn't get into, and I was also desperate for storage.

rehung the door, gutted the room and replaced the floorboards. We also added a black shower and stylish slimline storage.

hanging the bathroom became the number-one job for Hannah and Berran when renovating their 1970s detatched house. Due to problems in the property chain, they moved in uncomfortably close to the due date of their second daughter, so Hannah had to hit the ground running. A builder arrived the following day to change the boiler and radiators, but the bathroom itself was in desperate need of attention, too. 'We knew it was going to be awful as there were no photos online,' she says. 'As well as the smell and the awkward curved blue bath, it had a shower with no head, so we had to do something fast.'

Hannah acted decisively, settling on a darkgrey scheme with a flash of yellow on the main wall. She found the fittings she needed from Victorian Plumbing. 'Our bathroom is narrow and storage was a priority, so I was delighted with the all-in-one slimline basin and the vanity worktop. And the hidden cistern sits behind a beautiful anthracite panel – I love the colour so much I have it everywhere in the house now,' she says. A black shower and taps were at the top of Hannah's wish list, followed by pale-grey tiles and a patterned floor. 'I like a super slick, modern look, but the yellow wall was a wild card inspired by the sunny trim on a set of geometric towels we'd seen, which I thought the kids would like,' she says.

Work began soon after Grace was born, but things didn't go to plan. Rotten floorboards needed replacing, the walls had to be levelled before they could be tiled and the basin was broken in half when it arrived. 'We had so many delays and then Berran and I painted the yellow wall with an eggshell paint that was too shiny, but also started to peel off,' recalls Hannah. 'It almost broke us, but we started again with Crown's tough easyclean emulsion, made sure we had good ventilation, and got through it. Now we have a bright, fun room with all the storage we need. My favourite feature is the customised shower screen and how it complements the black fixtures and fittings. Our bathroom ticks all the boxes now.'
