

The BIG DIG:

Mark your calendars now for Saturday, July 17th, 2021!!!

We are planning to have the Big Dig at Mrs. Nether's farm on Saturday, July 17th. Members who want to come should meet at the club at 8:00am, with our departure time at 8:30am. The clubs are paying only for the digging fee to open the new pit for flint collection. Members can car pool, or drive individually. Members will have to pay their own entry fee (\$ 7.50) and must pay for their own flint (at 50 cents per pound) whatever you collect and decide to keep.

For those newbies who have never attended – we meet at the clubhouse and from there we form a car caravan of whoever wants to drive the two hours down south to Mrs. Nether's farmland. We make a pit stop when we get into the area, then on to the BIG DIG. It's in the woods, bring some bug spray if you like, a bucket or something to collect rocks.

SOME of the protective tools you should bring are enough water both to drink and to wash your stones, a brush (to help to see what you've got), eye protection, leather gloves, a kneeling pad or knee protection, good leather shoes or boots, long pants and long-sleeved shirt (flint chips will fly!), a digging/prying tool if preferred, buckets or containers for your collection (stones are heavy!), a hammer or copper whapper (a technical term), and something to eat or share. We are usually there for a couple of hours, but with 2 hours each way, it makes a long day of heavy lifting and great camaraderie. There is a port-a-john (which is only cleaned weekly or so, so drink enough to keep hydrated but don't overdo it, ladies, lol!) It's great fun – please consider joining us.

We will begin meeting in person the 2nd Tuesday of the month for the rest of the year. Please join us at 7pm on July 13th, 2021 at the Polish American Club in Akron. Meetings will also continue to be available Via Zoom. Coffee, bottled water and individual snacks will be available. <u>Please don't bring snacks to share at this time</u>. Gems provided by members:

SPHERE MACHINE

Bob Spore shared this with our Facebook page: "Here is a message I got from former member, Rufus Wayne Jessup-Savage. Anyone interested?"

Rufus wrote, "I'm looking for a home for a sphere machine. I got it from Bob Franks a few years ago. It needs some work. Needs reworked. As far as I know the motors are still good. And I have the diamond cups that go one it. It is free to a good home. If you want it or know someone that does, please let me know."

FANCY RIVET HEADS

For a nice-looking rivet head, use brass escutcheon pins. You'll have perfectly rounded heads that are all the same size and shape. The pins are a little hard to find, so try the best hardware stores first. Be sure to get solid brass pins, not brass plated steel. If unsure, test them with a magnet.

The pins are readily available online. Lee Valley Tools has them in 16 or 18 gauge and lengths from 1/4 inch to 1 inch. Go to http://www.LeeValley.com and do an item search on "escutcheon pin"

For best results, select a drill that gives you a hole

with a close fit to the rivet. Trim the rivet to a leave



a little less than one diameter sticking out the back side. Place the head on a scrap of hard plastic on the anvil so as to not flatten the head. I prefer a ball peen hammer (with a small 3/8-inch ball) for setting the rivet.

EASIER PRONG SETTING

When setting stones in a prong mount, the tool is less likely to slip off the prong if you grind a shallow groove into its face or rough up the face a bit with sandpaper. Some folks prefer a prong pusher for doing this, and others like a set of pliers with a slight groove on one jaw.



The easiest way to create a slot on the pusher is with a file, and the guickest way to create a slot on one jaw of your pliers is with a separating disc. Then do a rough polish on the slot with a medium grit, knife-edge silicone wheel.




