IDEA #1: Merrily, You Roll Along

Put on the playlist in the car as you drive (and drive, and drive) from Christmas pageant practice to last-minute holiday shopping. Keep this PDF in your glove compartment or car console and have your kid choose a conversation starter to discuss based on a song they hear.

IDEA #2: Taste and See

We're not usually fans of phones at the dinner table, but we'll make this one exception. During family dinners, pull up the Advent Calendar at Axis.org on your mobile device. Each day on the Advent calendar links to a song as well as a short reflection, tied to scripture and read by one of our culture writers. Listen together while you're eating, and wrap with the recommended conversation starter while you clean up!

IDEA #3: Comfort and Joy

If you observe Sabbath (or just find it easier to spend time together on the weekends), you can adapt this content to that practice. Every Sunday morning, we'll be sending out an email that hosts the songs and reflections for the week ahead. You can use that email for reference as you snuggle with some blankets and your hot drink of choice to listen to the songs, pray together, and kick off conversations about hope, joy, peace, and love.


