## We looked at the following Scripture passages:

- Philippians 3:17
- 1 Corinthians 11:1

You'll enjoy reading these powerful passages that spell out qualities to look for when imitating others. These passages also highlight the importance of imitation in spiritual growth.

## NEXT STEPS . .

During the next week as you have time to talk with your teenager, remember that one way that will help him or her to understand and apply what he or she has learned is to explain it to someone else. Use the following questions to guide your conversation:

- You talked a lot about what qualities make up a person you would want to imitate in your own spiritual walk. Were there any of these qualities that you want to improve in your own life? (Share where you want to improve spiritually as well)
- OK, so the Bible says that we should imitate those who are more spiritually mature than ourselves. But shouldn't we just imitate Jesus only? Doesn't everyone else still sin? Why is it important to imitate other more mature believers?
- It's awesome that God gives us examples in others of what it looks like to walk with Him throughout our lives. How does it make you feel that you don't have to figure out how to grow alone?
