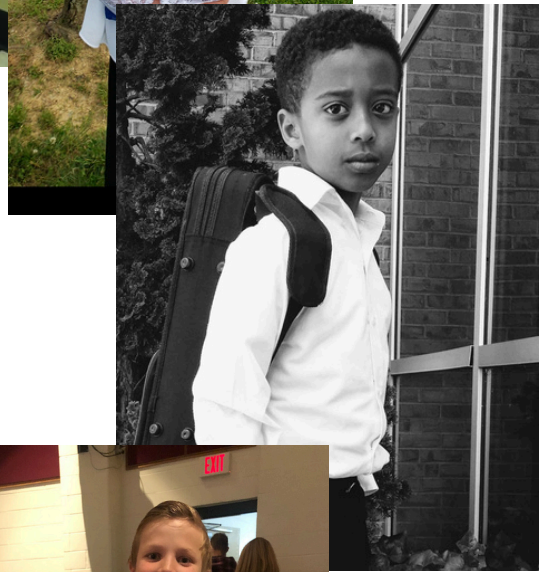

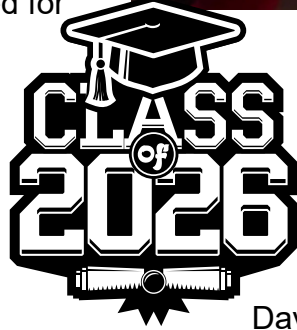
Future Artists

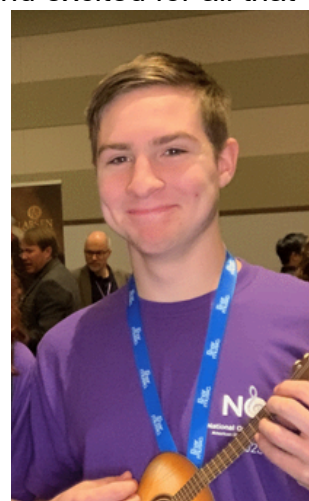

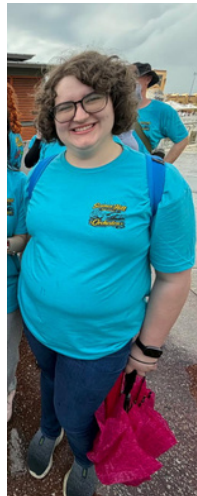

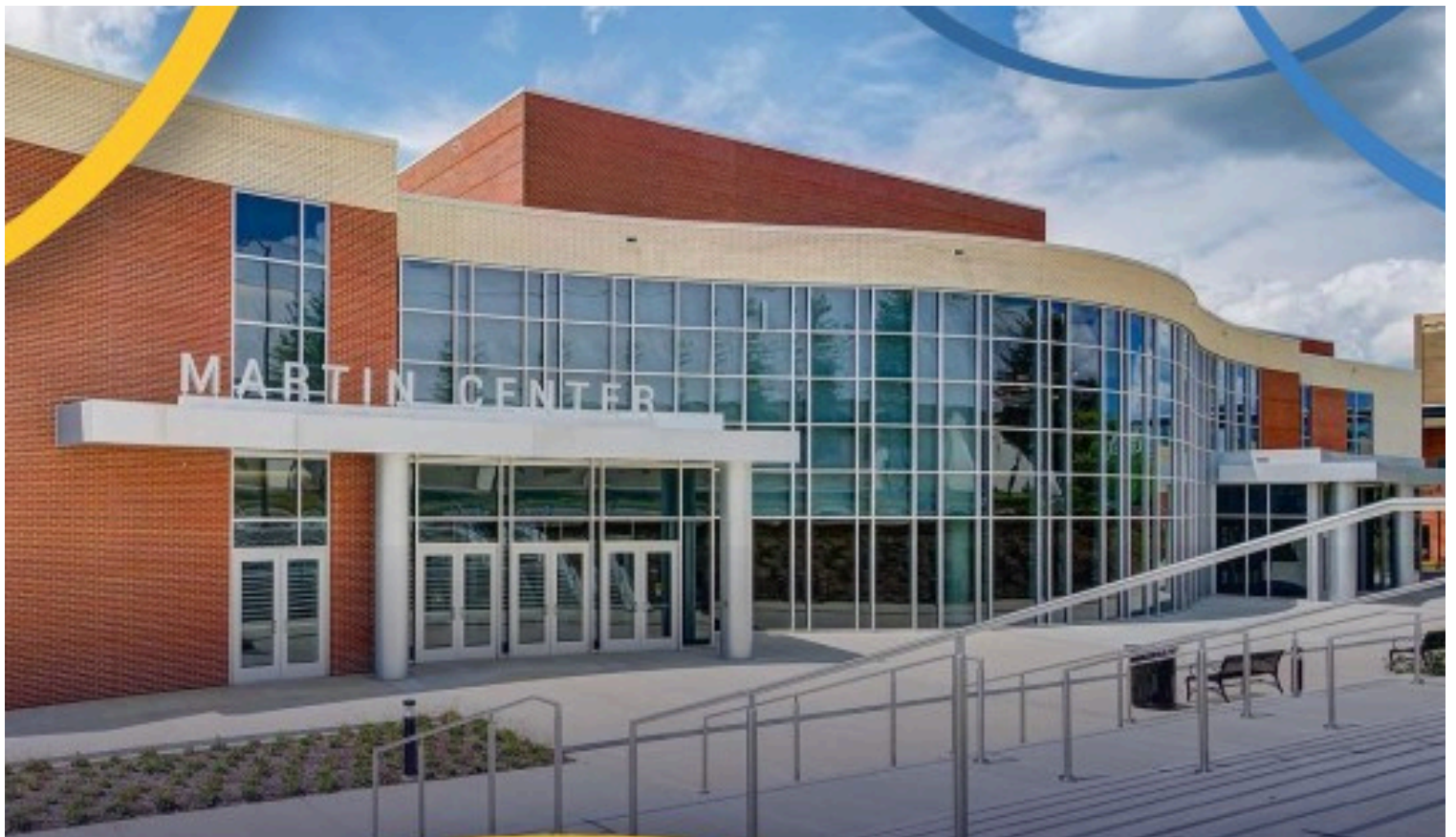
