Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During the period April 1st 2017 until March 31st 2018 the Fabulous Foundation organised a large sporting event with over 300 competitors, several local 5km events and several virtual events in order to raise funds and so be able to give grants to enable children and young people under the age of 25 to remain in education or partake of education activities.

During this time we were able to give grants for the following:-

pay for student travel, pay for several children to go on school trips, purchase a refurbished laptop for a student, pay exam fees for a student Give grants to the North Dorset Explorer scouts, the air ambulance for educational talks, contribute to the Honeypot charity, Pay for music lessons, Contribute towards the cost of school uniforms, Pay for text books, Pay for children to attend a drama group Make a contribution towards the cost of the Duke of Edinburgh course at a local school.

We are a small charity and have no investment policy. Our key objectives are to help as many people as we can who apply to us.


