Rhinos are under siege, especially in South Africa where indiscriminate poaching is driving these beautiful animals to extinction. The desired bounty? Those long appendages that majestically protrude from their snouts. Rhino horn is a staple commodity in many Asian countries, primarily as a symbol of wealth and power, a party drug for the wealthy, and a material for carvings, curios, and everyday objects. It is also a component of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM).

In Africa and beyond, sophisticated criminal networks have now replaced opportunistic poachers, posing an increasing threat to human life and imperiling tourism's economic stability.

Political change is desperately needed, but it's not the only challenge. In order to create a global force for change, we need to empower ourselves through social awareness and education.
