

In **1912**, President Taft appointed Chicago clubwoman Julia Lathrop as Chief of the Children's Bureau, GFWC worked with the bureau to promote public healthcare for mothers and infants.

1916, At the time of GFWC's Biennial Convention, when Ione Cowles is elected GFWC International President, most State Federations has active peace committees. The GFWC continued to promote peace until America is drawn into world conflict in February 1917.

1917, Immediately after President Wilson's announcement that diplomatic relations with Germany have been severed, GFWC responded with a telegram of support; "The General Federation of Woman's Club stands loyally behind the government. It is our desire to serve the nation to the best of our ability." The GFWC established the war Service Office in Washington D.C. "This Service Office has been created to be the actuary between the Departments of the General Federation and the Departments of Washington."
