We will be playing Dirty Santa again this year if you are interested. To avoid any confusion, rules to the game are provided below.

Participation is strictly voluntary.



- 1. Place your wrapped \$10 gift on the table upon entering.
- 2. Pick a number
- 3. The person with #1 chooses a gift, unwraps it, shows it off, and puts it on display. Gifts must stay in view at all times and remain in their original packaging until that item is out of play see rule #7.
- 4. #2 chooses to either steal #1's gift or selects a new gift from the table.
- 5. #3 chooses to steal #1 or #2's gift or selects a new gift. If #3 steals #1's gift, #1 can either steal #2's gift or choose an unopened gift from the table.
- 6. A gift cannot be stolen back during the same turn. Example: If #3 steals #2's gift, #2 cannot steal the gift back until the next turn.
- 7. A gift can be stolen up to three (3) times before it is frozen and can no longer be stolen. The gift is frozen with the fourth owner.
- 8. If #1 has the same gift they started with, and no one has stolen from them, they get to trade with any unfrozen gift.

Have fun and remember stealing is encouraged!

- All members are asked to please donate approximately <u>14 dozen</u> homemade cookies. Feel
 free to use several different recipes to bake the total or close to it the more variety we have,
 all the better! As most of you recall, last year we had a wonderful attendance by our loyal
 supporters, BUT we ran out of cookies very earlier. (It's hard to hold a cookie walk with no
 cookies for our repeat guests[®].)
- We're looking for your most festive and decorative Christmas cookie recipes. Though it's tempting, please do not bring store-bought, premade cookies that you've decorated. We do boast that our cookies are "homemade", and our keen-eyed guests can tell the difference!
- Please place or wrap cookies in <u>air-tight</u> disposable container, such as:
 - Plastic food storage containers
 - Disposable aluminum food tins with lids or sealed with foil
 - Dollar store-type \$1 decorative boxes with lids or sealed with foil
 - Recycle your used deli trays or cake holders with sealed lids
- Also, please identify your cookies by name (or create a festive one) by placing a tag on your container – we will make it visible when it's open for display. Note any important ingredients such as nuts, raisins, cranberries, chocolate, white chocolate, etc.

Once again, the committee is asking everyone to please deliver your cookies to the Village Hall on $\underline{\text{Fridav afternoon the 9}^{\text{th}}}$, between 3:00 – 4:30 p.m. We ask that you please $\underline{\text{not}}$ bring them the morning of the Cookie Walk, nor bring them to our dinner on the 8th.

If you are unable to drop off on Friday, please make other arrangements ahead of time with another club or committee member to deliver for you. You can also call Connie Coshenet for help.
